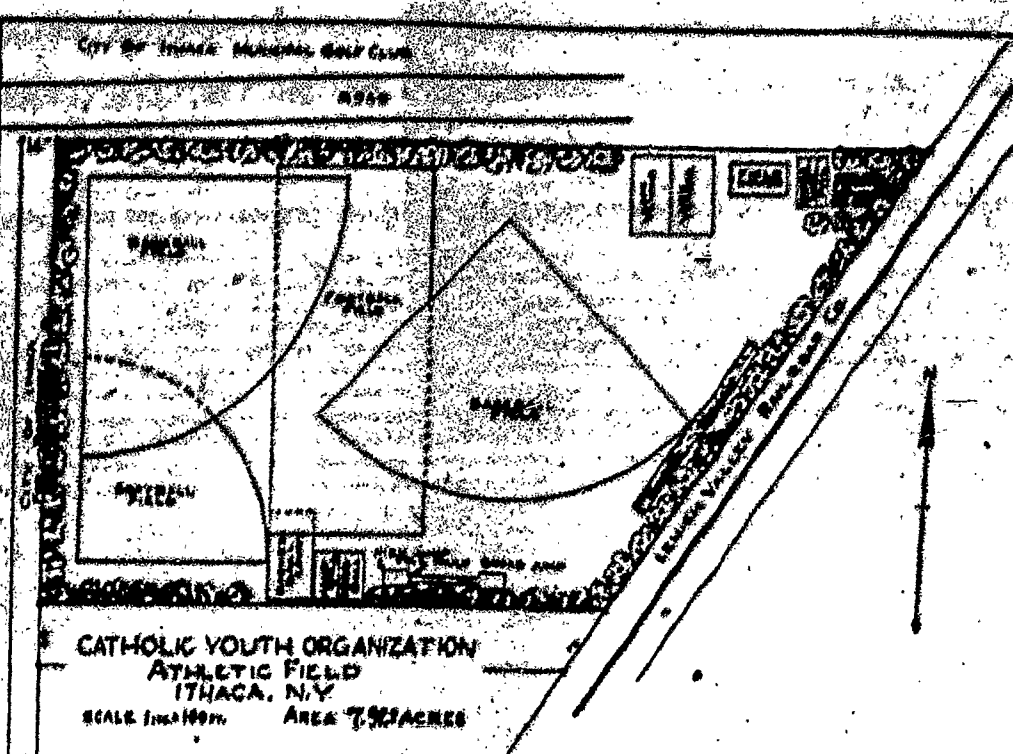

CYOPurchasesLand For Athletic Field

Ithaca — (Special) — The Catholic Youth Organization of Immaculate Conception parish has acquired property of nearly 8 acres adjoining the Newman Municipal Golf Course for the development of a complete athletic field.

The new sports field is located on the Flat Road, an extension of Willow Ave. The property was obtained for the CYO by purchase from Mr. and Mrs. John Crepinich through Joseph J. Kialy.

The officers and advisory board members of the CYO headed by the Rev. John Hedges, assistant pastor of Immaculate Conception Church and the organization's spiritual advisor, have already begun a long range program for the development of baseball diamonds, a football field, basketball, handball and tennis courts, track events and a picnic grove on the new property.

A baseball field in the center of the proposed layout will be the first project in the 6-year program of construction. The final development of the athletic field will include facilities for the whole family and will provide a place for many parish activities.

The Catholic Youth Organization was established by Father Hedges and a committee of men of the parish under the approval of Rev. William Joyce, pastor of Immaculate Conception, in October, 1940, for all the Catholic boys of high school age in Ithaca. Operating under control of an Advisory Board and a staff of counselors, the boys manage their own program of religious, social and athletic activities. The members receive Holy Communion in a body on the first Sunday of each month and hold meetings on the first and third Sundays. In its first year, the CYO has sponsored basketball and baseball teams in city competition, held several dances and arranged group outings in local parks.

Winter Program
For the winter months, four rooms in the Ithaca Journal building have been furnished as lounge and clubrooms with pool-table, ping-pong, radio, coke and candy machines, chairs, tables, games and reading matter.

The development of the new athletic field will provide summer activities and will increase the scope and attractiveness of the whole CYO program.

The present officers are: President, Francis Dooley; vice-president, Robert Taylor; secretary, William E. Waters, and treasurer, John Glanville.

Germans Resent British History

Cologne — Deep resentment has been caused among Catholics throughout the British zone of occupation in Germany by the adoption in the schools of the province of North-Rhine-Westphalia of a new history text book which embodies some of the worst slanders on the church ever printed.

The book deals with German history since the Middle Ages and was written by Franz Mehring, a socialist who died several years ago. Mehring used statements about the Christian religion made by writers such as Marx and Engels which are long outworn. He accuses the church of meddling with politics and describes the clergy as "loafers." The papacy, to him is a "superstitious institution established to keep the masses ignorant, and for their exploitation."

Protestants are attacked just as viciously and one denomination particularly is described as of "limited intelligence." Although there is a shortage of newspaper throughout Germany 10,000 copies of this book were printed and distributed under the responsibility of the British authorities of occupation.

Men Who Televised Pope Return to United States

Columbus, N. J. — (NC) — The five-man American television crew which telecast Pope Pius XII at the Vatican City for the first time has returned to the United States. The men are employed by the Radio Corporation of America here.

The crew worked four days installing the equipment at the Vatican to present a special broadcast for Pope Pius XII. The program consisted of the Vatican Choir and familiar scenes of nearby areas televised with the aid of telephoto lenses. After the broadcast the Pope was telecast and saw himself on a near-by television receiver. He also visited with the technical crew and inspected the equipment.

Frank M. Folsom, RCA Division executive who arranged for the Vatican demonstration, was awarded a Consistory Commemorative Medal by the Holy Father, as were members of the television crew.

Magazines Hit On Moral Lack

Washington — (NC) — Stiffest articles on sex ethics are being inserted in "the older and better-class magazines that have long found entrance into decent American homes" as a subtle and particularly harmful part of a "deliberate conspiracy against chastity in the United States to day," a Catholic priest has warned here.

The Rev. Dr. Edgar Schmiedeler, O.S.A., director of the Family Life Bureau, National Catholic Welfare Conference, cited as an example a recent series of mother-daughter articles in a nationally-circulated magazine, which he said in a prepared statement "in final analysis . . . rejected every item of traditional sex ethics."

"The subtlety and sentimentality that characterized them unquestionably made them even more dangerous than if they had been written in more brazen and shocking form. The latter type of article repels many by its very audacity and shamelessness," he explained.

"Generally in the articles a totally false basis for sex morals is used," he continued. "The wish or whim or convenience of the individual is the guiding principle, the deciding factor as to right or wrong. The real basis is rejected. The reason for the creation of the two sexes, the purpose of sex and marriage, the child, the perpetuation of the human race—these things are not even mentioned."

"Parents may well examine carefully the current literary output before they permit it in their homes, lest that be admitted which will be an occasion of sin for their children," Father Schmiedeler cautioned, at the same time mentioning that the availability of much wholesome and entertaining literature today makes it completely unnecessary to patronize the purveyors of printed filth.

Most Catholics In Hindu India

Cincinnati — The majority of Catholics in the Indian peninsula are in the new Dominion of India, according to information compiled by the Catholic Students' Mission Crusade, at its national center here.

The information printed in the "CSMC Mission News Map" for September, shows that approximately 4,333,000 Catholics are in the Hindu-dominated State of India and 162,000 are in the predominantly Moslem State of Pakistan. Of the 54 dioceses, 44 are in the new India State and seven in Pakistan. The remaining dioceses are found in the independent sections of the peninsula, with a Catholic population of 90,000.

The bulk of the India Catholic population is south of a line between the northern boundary of the Province of Bombay and the city of Calcutta. In this region there are 30 dioceses.

611-Year-Old Polish Church Reconstructed

New York — (NC) — Reconstruction of the historic Church of St. Dorothy, which dates back to 1336, was witnessed by a throng of 30,000 persons in Grodzic, Poland. Bishop Teodor Kubina of Czechoslovakia, officiated in place of Bishop Stanislaw Adamski of Katowice, who was ill. At the conclusion of the ceremony, Bishop Kubina placed a miraculous image of Our Lady of Consolation on the main altar.
