



## State Advocate Slated At Columbus Day Dinner

John P. McArdle, of Brooklyn, and state advocate of the Knights of Columbus will address members of Rochester Council, K. of C. and their guests at a dinner in Powers Hotel Saturday, Oct. 11 at 7 p. m., marking the opening of the annual Columbus Day observance.

Religious observance will be a Mass to be celebrated by His Excellency, Bishop James E. Kearney, past state chaplain at St. Joseph's Church Sunday, Oct. 12 at 9 a. m. Sermon will be preached by the Very Rev. Father J. Funcke, state chaplain of Husonburg, N. Y.

A practicing attorney in New York City, Mr. McArdle is widely known for his Catholic lay activity. He is a past grand knight of Brooklyn's Columbus council, largest unit in the order and has served for 20 years as chairman of the council's Catholic Interests Committee.

He headed for five years as chairman, the New York State Scholarship Committee and for two years was chairman of Catholic Affairs. He is holder of the Sodalily Medal for outstanding Catholic Activity in the Diocese of Brooklyn. A speaker of reputation he last year was principal speaker before a gathering of 33,000 men at a Holy Name Rally in Ebbets Field.

Toastedmaster at the dinner will be Charles A. Tucker, also widely known as a speaker on Catholic topics. A program of entertainment will be presented by Lecturer Raymond L. Nary.

Heading the arrangements is General Chairman Ralph F. Murphy with Joseph B. Rooney vice chairman. Special decorations will be installed by Chairman John W. Degus.

Named to serve on the Columbus Day committee also are Reception, Grand Knight John J. Kinney, Program, Harold H. Connor, Dinner, Rocco F. Natale and publicity, Thomas H. O'Connor, past grand knight.

Tickets and reservations are being handled by Chairman Frank J. Thomas and James Izzo. Transportation is in charge of Michael J. Schopp.
