Swiss Bishops Issue Pastoral

Basel — (NC) — The present world crisis, says the Swiss Hierarchy in a Pastoral issued on the occasion of Switzerland's Thanksgiving Day, is a justification of Christianity more impressive and stirring than any other that could be conceived.
"From the terrible which anti-Christian heresies, bitter fruits have arisen," the Bishops declare. "A world is coming to an end. Human society, and especially Western society, is about to undergo such changes that the chain of tradition is being broken, all harmony of laws destroyed and the value of an established order left in doubt. Horrified, modern man experiences what a plight he is facing after he has banned Christ's justice and charity from his heart."
"The whole of human society today is hostile to Christ. Its leaders have sacrificed decency, humility and the love of God to the spirit of the world and now what it means to have abandoned God... Christians have given up to permeate with Divine Love the fast development of wealth and technical progress."
In the face of this chaos, the Bishops continue, just as at the time of the fall of the Roman Empire, the Church remains quiet and conscious of its eternal mission. She is not afraid to assume the leadership for the future.

1650 Calvary Painting Found

New Orleans — (NC) — The "lost" canvas in the walls of the rectory of St. Louis Cathedral is thought to have only three years of being there, according to a local artist.
It is a crucifixion scene, approximately two by three feet, and was found in the attic of the rectory. E. E. Foster, artist of the Louisiana Museum, who restored it, attributed it to Nicholas Poussin, judging by the style. Later the finding of the letters "P.M." on the left of Poussin is revised, after the manner of some painters, confirmed his opinion. The picture is thought to have been painted about 1650.

Catholic Charities Aids 200,000 Needy

Vladivostok — (RNS) — Polish "Caritas" Catholic welfare organization, is supplying money, food and clothing to 200,000 needy persons in the western provinces acquired by Poland, officials here stated.
Since the end of 1945, the organization has established in 128 soup kitchens, 157 kindergartens and 72 orphanages in these areas, as well as 54 hospitals, and 156 homes for the aged. Caritas also conducts 22 colleges and 54 schools where tuition is free.

New York — (NC) — Bishop Lawrence Graner, C.S.C., explained here today for Calcutta, India, enroute to his See city of Dacca in Eastern Pakistan. The Bishop was accompanied by the Rev. Charles Young, C.S.C., who is returning to the Bengal missions, and the Rev. Thomas Fitzpatrick, C.S.C., of the Holy Cross congregation, who is on a visit to India.

"Western Europe has so far not received a farthing by virtue of the Marshall Plan, yet the territorial waters are already being sailed by the American fleet, and the countries of western Europe are full of American observers, investigators and other representatives. The Marshall Plan is a frenzied expansion program of the American monopolies. It constitutes one of the most serious threats to peace and democracy."

Notre Dame School Starts Germ Free Life Researches


Notre Dame, Ind. — (NC) — Long-range scientific experiments were inaugurated here today as Bishop Lawrence G. Graner, C.S.C., of Dacca, India, blessed the construction for a new Laboratory for Germ-Free Life at the University of Notre Dame. Enclosed in the construction were biological specimens to be studied by future generations of scientists, when the building is raised in possibly 200 years.
Included in material sealed in the construction are bacteria, viruses, protozoa, insects, worm eggs and fungi. Bacteria cultures were

Types "A" and "B" human blood were sealed with the other material in an effort to determine if the types of human blood changes or remain the same during the period. Every vitamin known to the medical world today was placed in the construction so that future scientists will be able to tell whether or not they have retained their potency.
Other enclosures in the construction include: animal tissues from germ-free animals and other animals; certain plant seeds to determine whether or not they will grow after emerging from the sealed construction; human blood samples, to show some of the present diseases of the present era and to determine whether or not they will remain viable.


