School Recreation Program Banishes Youth Delinquency

(Continued from Page 1) We have not had a case of delinquency in three years. I am completely sold on the whole program not for the physical benefit of the children alone, but for the improvement in their attitude toward school. These activities have given the children happiness to come here, a new school spirit and sanction for discipline and poor school work.

In explaining how the activities have been such a "complete solution of disciplinary problems" in St. Mary's, Father Toole said that a child becomes inebriated for any part in athletics for a week if he is tardy or unprepared in class or disobedient and troublesome in conduct.

Even the high schoolers attend their weekly religion classes well because they want a share in the evening programs planned for them in the gym," he says. SCENE OF ALL the indoor athletics is a 55x55-foot gymnasium with a 23-foot high ceiling which was formerly an obsolete auditorium. It has the only regulation sized basketball court in Elmira and is also adapted for handball, dancing, and all indoor games. The \$15,000.00 gym is the parish social center and the meeting place for parochial or social activities. Elaborate kitchen facilities are adjacent to the ball and lockers, showers and toilet rooms are nearby in the basement.

When school closes for the summer the program goes right on with a Parish Day Camp operating for six weeks and attracting over 100 youngsters a day. Hanging in age from four and a half to eleven years, the children come to the school playground Monday to Friday, 9 a. m. to 4

p. m. A full program of activities, craft work, bicycle hikes, swimming parties, picnics, group trips to nearby parks and pools and even fishing expeditions fill their days. Quatraro trains his own corps of counselors for these summer duties.

A feature attraction of the school year is an annual Outdoor Circus with an all-star cast of 420 children. Every pupil in the school takes part. The show plays to audiences of over 1,000 people who proudly watch the games, stunts, playlets and musical numbers that the children present. Last year's profit from the circus was \$2,300.00—sufficient to buy books and school supplies for every pupil in the school this fall, thus removing a hard seasonal burden from parents and putting the scholastic work in high gear from the first day that school opened.

Czech Priest Criticized As Member of Communists

New York (NC) - Articles which appeared in several Czechoslovak Catholic publications, just received here, throw a revealing light on the status of the Rev. Joseph Straka, a Slovak Catholic priest who according to American press agency dispatches, acknowledged his membership in the Communist party.

The priest, who holds a high position in the "Povernictvo," the Slovak ministry of schools, said, according to the press agency dispatches, that "no Catholic priest could agree with the ideology of the Communist party, and I reject it," adding, however, that "its political program is acceptable, so I support it."

Katolické Noviny (Catholic News) a weekly publication appearing in Bratislava, capital of Slovakia, in its July 27, 1947, issue, published an open letter addressed to "Dr. Joseph Straka" and signed by "The Editor."

The author of the letter pointed out that he speaks "in the name of about 150,000 subscribers to Katolické Noviny" and continued: "And whom do you speak for? For one unfortunate priest who today stands under ecclesiastical investigation whom Catholic public opinion has condemned long ago."

Internuncio to Egypt Enroute to His Post

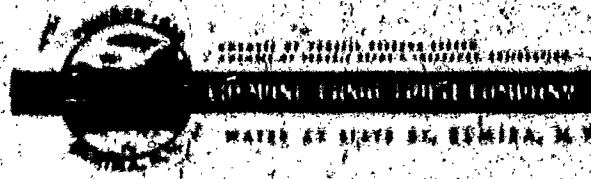
