**Vatican Denies
World Unit Tie**

Rome (RNS) — Vatican authorities have denied reports that Pope Pius XII is planning to launch an international Catholic federation to embrace all Catholic Action associations in countries throughout the world.

According to Vatican officials,

rumors that the Pope has drawn up a proposed constitution for a new international organization and will disclose his plans at

celebrations next month marking the 25th anniversary of the Union of Italian Catholic Men

are "entirely unfounded."

"People too often forget," one spokesman declared, "that a Catholic international has existed for centuries—the Roman Catholic Church."

Informants declared that a number of International Catholic groups in specific fields of interest are at present in existence, including the International Congress of Catholic Women's Leagues, International Pax Romana, the International Catholic Movement for the Cinema and Radio, and the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, which engages in charitable work.

It was announced meanwhile that to date 18 nations will be represented at the celebrations to be held here from September 8 to 9 by the Union of Italian Catholic Men. The countries are Argentina, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Chile, France, England, India, Holland, Poland, Switzerland, Turkey, and the Portuguese, Spain, Switzerland, Turkey, and the United States.

Ottawa, Ontario City (RNS) — Construction of a \$10,000,000 Catholic center, which will include a high school, a Knights of Columbus Home, and a Residential Hotel for aged Catholics is being planned here. Work on the project is expected to begin in 1948.
