






#### 24 Monsignori to be Invested by Bishop In Rites at Pro-Cathedral November 11 Twenty-four diocesan priests, newly honored by Pope Pius XIL will be invested with the robes of monsignorship November 11 at the Pro-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in special ceremonies at which His Excellency, Illshop Kearner will preside. The Supreme Pontiff, as announced Friday, has konored the Diocese of Rochester by naming three Pretontary Apostolics, eighteen domestic prelates with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor, and three papel chamberlains

with the title of Very Reverend Monsignor.

The investiture rite will take place on the tenth anniversary of the installation of Bishop Kearney.




