**Auburnians Acclaim First Monsignor
Appointed in History of Deanery**

Auburn—The City of Auburn has its first three monsignori in the appointment by His Holiness Pope Pius as domestic prelates of the Very Rev. Dean John A. Conway, the Rev. Dr. William E. Cowen and the Rev. Adolph L. Gabbani.

Notification of the appointment from Most Rev. Archbishop Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to the United States in Washington through His Excellency, the Most Rev. James E. Keane, Bishop of Rochester, was received at noon last Friday.

THE HONORS were acclaimed by Auburnians generally and by parishioners and friends of the three prelates in particular. Congratulations were received from parishioners, the press, city and county officials and the citizenry at large.

Dean Conway is pastor of Holy Family Church and a native of Canandaigua; Doctor Cowan is pastor of St. Mary's Church and a native of Auburn and Father Gabbani is pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church and a native of Italy.

The honors had particular significance here as it is the first time in the history of the Church in Auburn and Cayuga County that an active pastor of an Auburn church has received the Papal award.

Monsignor William F. Bergan, Chancellor of Rochester diocese, and Monsignor James Gordon Stafford of Seattle, Wash., are natives of Auburn but did not become domestic prelates until many years after leaving their native cities.
