IN THE PAST SIX MONTHS three events connected deserved nation-wide attention. work for the American Teleor one of its affiliates. The serand event was the creation of the Telephonie Workers Organ 1 tzing Committee by the C. I. O. This is the first attempt by a large federation to organize relephone workers on a wholesale scale. Its operations are shrouded in secrecy and it is difficult to discover how many members the TWOC actually has enrolled. THE MAIN DIFFICULTY which faces any telephone union is the rank and file telephone worker himself who is indifferent to the workings of his telephone union. But the thousands of girls who make up the accounting and traffic departments of any telephone company have weak unions The reason is simple. The men depend on their jobs for their very existence. The girls expect to be married in a few veau so it does not make anv difference to them what their
