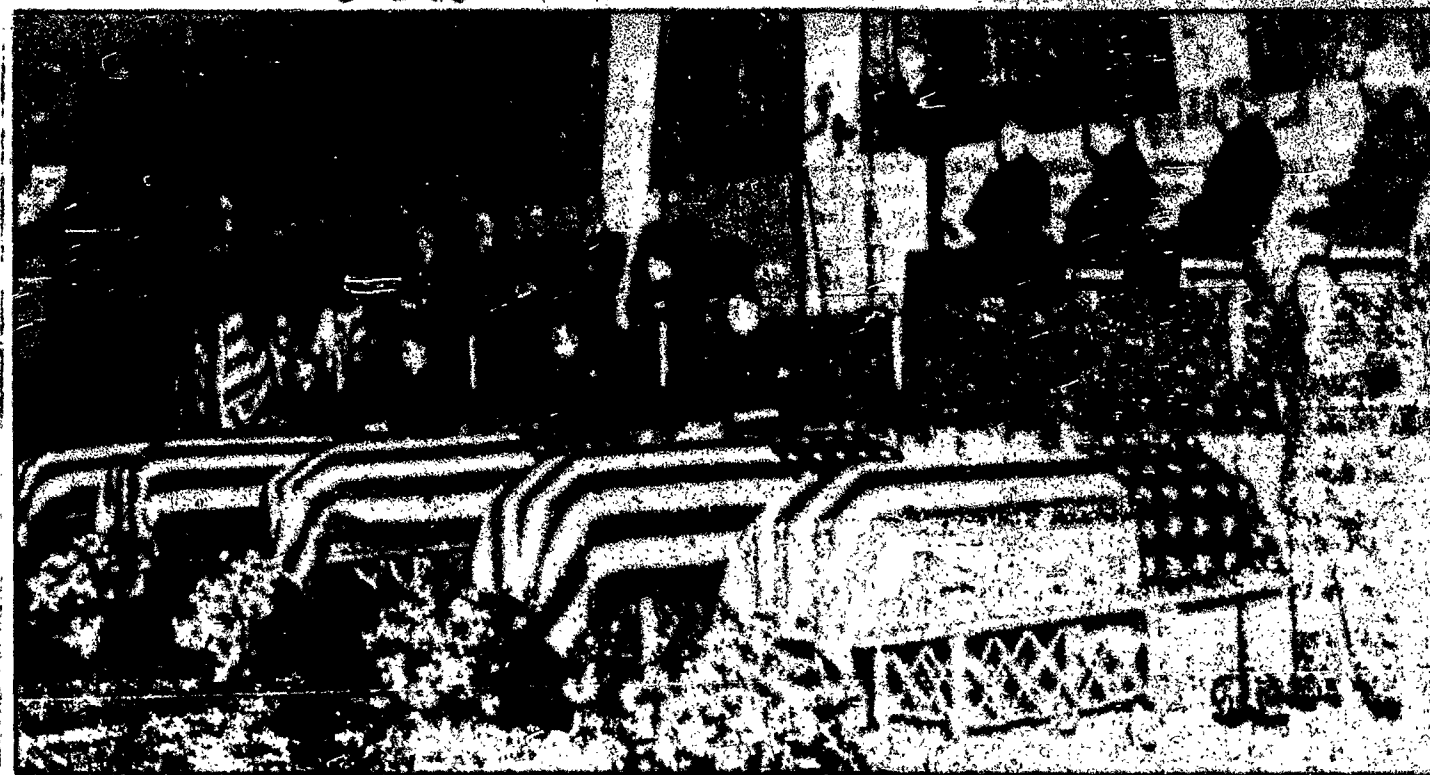

As County Pays Tribute on Fallen Heroes' Return

Notre Dame Nuns' Centenary Marked at Holy Redeemer

Holy Redeemer Church was the scene of an impressive ceremony commemorating the centenary of the School Sisters of Notre Dame in America when the Rt. Rev. Monsignor William F. Stauder, assisted by Rev. Raymond Wahl and Rev. William Schifferl, offered a solemn High Mass of thanksgiving. The children sang the "Alma Mater" Mass.

A most appropriate tribute to the sisters was given by Monsignor Stauder. Immediately after Mass the blessed Sacrament was exposed and the school children had prayer hours until 11:30 when Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament was given.

In the afternoon the children of the school dramatized the history of the order from its humble beginning with Alex Le Clerc in 1598 to the re-establishment of the order under the direction of Mother Teresa in 1833.

Many requests for the sisters came to Mother Teresa. In answer to the plea of America for her sisters, Mother Teresa, accompanied by Sister Caroline, arrived in the new missionary field in 1847. Sister Caroline was later appointed Mother Superior of all the missions in America and became one of the most successful organizers of the parochial school system in the United States.

The children represented the various fields of labor in which the sisters are engaged. Every type of school is taught by the School Sisters of Notre Dame. From the northern shores of Canada to the islands of the South Atlantic from the Atlantic coast to the Pacific the Indian, the Negro, the deaf and dumb, the orphan, are lovingly taught and cared for by the self-sacrificing sisters. The order has grown by leaps and bounds and today 5,000 sisters teach 152,000 children in 350 schools in our beloved country.

and by Rt. Rev. Mgr. Charles F. Shay, pastor of Holy Rosary Church, Rochester. Monsignors Cowen and Shay were successive spiritual directors of the Retreat League during the years from 1915 to 1941 when the laymen's retreats were conducted at St. Bernard's Seminary in Rochester. Monsignor Cowen had the Papal honor of Domestic Prelate conferred on him recently and will be inducted into his new honors by Bishop Kearney on Nov. 11.

Among those who will be seated at the speakers' table will be James P. Duffy of Rochester, former congressman, who was one of the small group that made the first laymen's retreat in the diocese at St. Bernard's Seminary in 1915, and who has been an active retreatant ever since. Mr. Duffy is expected to reminisce on the early days of the retreat movement in the diocese and tell how it was organized.

The Retreat League comprises all the laymen of the diocese, who make an annual retreat at Our Lady of the Lake, the Diocesan Retreat House at Medina. A retreat is held each weekend during the season from May through November, and the different weekends are assigned to groups from different parishes of the diocese. Elmer J. Bloomer, chairman of the ticket committee, expects upwards of 400 retreatants will attend.
