Lithuanians Left With One Bishop, UN Told

Washington — (NC) — An appeal to the United Nations to give immediate consideration to the "terrorizing" of the entire population in Lithuania and to the "brutal treatment of the clergy" there by the Soviet authorities has been made to Trygve Lie, U.N. secretary general.

Recalling a note addressed to Lie a year ago, in which he also protested the numerous arrests and deportations, the Lithuanian minister states that "a new device for terrorizing the population has been introduced by the Soviet authorities."

TOGETHER WITH his appeal Zadekis enclosed a supplementary appeal by the Supreme Lithuanian Committee of Lithuania which, he said, gives additional facts on "the mistreatment of Lithuanians by the Soviet authorities."

After asserting that the wave of arrests in Lithuania has especially affected members of the clergy, the supplementary appeal states that "at the present time there remains only one Bishop in the entire country."

WASHINGTON makes the same assertion and identifies the sole remaining member of the hierarchy as 72-year-old Bishop Hieronim Paltaras of Panevezys.

The appeal also states that the Bishop most recently to be arrested and deported by the Soviets according to "persistent reports" is Archbishop M. Rejzys of Vilna.

Maniu, Rumania Red Victim, a Catholic

Washington — (NC) — Dr. Juru Maniu, 55-year-old leader of the opposition National Front and party of Rumania, who after a "trial" on treason charges was sentenced to life imprisonment, has been a deeply believing and practicing Catholic all his life.

This is brought out in an article just received here which appeared last month in Die Furche (The Furrow), Catholic weekly published in Vienna, Austria. The author, Dr. Friedrich Fiedler, editor of Die Furche, and himself for many decades an outstanding personality in Central European Catholic Journalism, was acquainted with Dr. Maniu since 1905 when he represented Rumanian peasants in the Hungarian parliament.

IN THE 70 years of its existence as an independent country, Rumania has never had a national leader enjoying such popularity and authority as Dr. Maniu, writes Dr. Funder. "He became such a leader because of his great gifts as an orator and his unblemished private life. Over a period of 40 years, his courage and his party have kept him in this position and this in a country where abuse and corruption were characteristics of the political life from top to bottom."

AFTER POINTING out that Dr. Maniu was legal counsel of the Catholic Diocese of Alba Julia and prominent in many Catholic affairs, Dr. Funder continues: "The Rumanian peasants are grateful to him for having freed him from the domination by Rumanian landowners and from public corruption."

He then explains that Dr. Maniu's efforts to come to an understanding with Russia were even recognized in the Soviet Encyclopedia published in Moscow and that it was Dr. Maniu and his party who, on August 23, 1944, rose against the dictatorship of Antonescu and thus broke Hitler's domination over Rumania.

The character of Dr. Maniu's efforts is characterized by Secretary of State George C. Marshall as another instance of efforts "to eliminate every vestige of democratic opposition to the communist-dominated regimes" in eastern Europe.

THE STATURE of Mr. Maniu as an outstanding champion of democratic ideals in eastern Europe over many years, is unaffected by the sentence which has been imposed on him, Mr. Marshall stated.
