The article stated that the Scrippe Howard papers had come into possession of a communique sent out by the Communist Party headquarters, urging its 30 districts throughout the country to get behind the move being foatered by the Civil Rights Congreat The movement urges 500. 000 signatures by December 15 to a pelition supporting the resolution of Representative Adolph J. Sabath of Illinois, which calls for abolition of the Un American Activities Committee.

The communique emphasized. Mr. Woltman reported, that the half-million names petition would be presented by a delegation of "distinguished citizens," not by the Communist Party.
