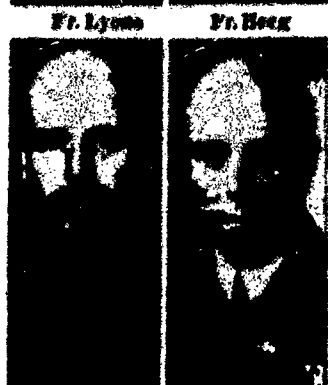
## Defeat Hate, Greed Pope Tells Senators

Yonkers City (NC) — The contrast between a merely military victory and a victory over the passions that block the way to a possible peace was pointed out by the Holy Father, Pope Pius XII, in remarks to four U. S. senators when he received in private audience.

The American legislators, members of the Senate Appropriations Committee, were Senators Guy Cordon of Oregon, Theodore F. Green of Rhode Island, William F. Knowland of California, and Milton R. Young of North Dakota.

The Holy Father referred to Armistice Day as a particularly memorable day in recent annals, a day reviving the memories of battles, of suffering mothers and of the jubilation of the victory won. As the years passed, the Pontiff continued, these jubiliations yielded to more sober and somber reflections on the price

## HOUSE PROBE REDS TARGET

New York (NC) — The Communist Party is going "all out" in an effort to get the House of Representatives Committee on Un-American Activities abolished, it has been disclosed in an article written by Frederick Woltman, in the New York World-Telegram.

The article stated that the Scripps-Howard papers had come into possession of a communique sent out by the Communist Party headquarters, urging its 30 districts throughout the country to get behind the move being fostered by the Civil Rights Congress. The movement urges 500,000 signatures by December 15 to a petition supporting the resolution of Representative Adolph J. Sabath of Illinois, which calls for abolition of the Un-American Activities Committee.

The communique emphasized, Mr. Woltman reported, that the half-million name petition would be presented by a delegation of "distinguished citizens," not by the Communist Party.

The Communist Party directive was sent out by Henry Winston, national organization secretary, the article related, and told the Red groups of the nation: "We consider this campaign of the greatest importance . . ."

We have therefore agreed to encourage the entire party in helping C.R.C. reach its goal of half million signatures by December 15. Speedy action in circulating these petitions is essential."

## French Bishop's Hail Germans

Trieste (NC) — The Catholic hierarchy of France offers "the kiss of peace" to their fellow bishops in Germany, said Bishop Dieard de la Vacquerie, chief of chaplains in the French zone of occupation, at a reception offered here by Archbishop Conrad Groeber of Freiburg at the observance of his golden sacerdotal jubilee.

Bishop de la Vacquerie said he had just attended a meeting of the French hierarchy who wanted him to convey their cordial wishes to Archbishop Groeber and to assure all German bishops of the deep interest of their brethren in France to cooperate with them as closely as possible in restoring friendly contacts and mutually profitable relations.

A 600-year-old silver bell which the Nazis had taken from the belfry of the cathedral here and which was found in Hamburg after the war was presented to Archbishop Groeber as a jubilee gift. He also received a new crozier, an artistic monstrance, a chalice and a fund of 200,000 marks collected among the clergy of the diocese for the reconstruction of the Freiburg theological seminary. He also received many food packages from friends in the United States which he distributed to the poor.

## Freedom Denial By Tito Told

Trieste (NC) — That there is nothing in Yugoslavia akin to western democracy and that all semblance of civil liberty has disappeared under the Tito regime are conclusions set forth in a new book just published here by S. Zaratin, entitled "Tito Unmasked."

The author cites a declaration of the Yugoslav dictator as follows: "Western Democracy as it appears in European countries outside the Russian orbit and in the United States will not be admitted by us."

As evidence that free elections do not exist, the author points to the fact that known persecutors of the Croatian people have been unanimously elected to office by the Croats.

He states that a Russian Army officer was placed in charge of UNRRA distributions in Yugoslavia and that ration priorities are determined by political affiliation.

An official catechism is promulgated, Mr. Zaratin states, which children are required to know by rote and which inculcates the belief that the clergy are enemies of the people. On the other hand, religious catechisms are banned.

## Bogus Priest Held; After Mass Stipends

Evansville, Ind. (NC) — An impostor posing as a priest and describing himself as Louis Pagan has been apprehended here as the result of detailed information and description which was circulated to Catholic editors throughout the nation by the N. C. W. C. News Service and published in The Priest, monthly magazine for the clergy.

The arrest came through the alertness of the Rev. Gabriel Verkamp, O.S.B., of St. Benedict's Rectory here, shortly after the man had called at the rectory, pretended to offer Mass and made a request for some Mass stipends.

## Japanese Acquire Military Cathedral

Osaka (NC) — The downtown building here known as the "Military Cathedral" to American soldiers who served on occupation duty in this area has been acquired by Bishop Paul Taguchi of the Diocese of Osaka.

The "cathedral" was inaugurated here during the first months of the occupation by Col. John K. Connelly, chaplain priest from Sacramento. It is an office building whose large ground floor was equipped with altars and pews to serve as church for U. S. Army personnel and Japanese Catholics.

## Papal Envoy to India Sees Religious Rights Upheld

Union City, N. J. (NC) — Archbishop Leo P. Kierkeks, C.P., Apostolic Delegate to India, believes that the religious rights of minorities will not be slighted by the new Indian Government.

In an exclusive interview at St. Michael's Passionist Monastery here, where he has been staying since his arrival in the United States, Archbishop Kierkeks pointed out that the Constitution for Hindustan, ratified last March, allows full freedom to "propagate" as well as to practice religion.

"There is a general feeling," said the venerable prelate, who is a member of the Passionist Congregation, "that the new regime will not make the situation worse for the missions and circumstances may make it better for the Church. The Hindus have been inclined to think that Christianity was privileged because the government was Christian. Now they will see the Church stand on her own."

As an indication of lack of discrimination against Catholics, the Archbishop recalled that the Rev. Jerome D'Souza, S.J., rector of Loyola College, was elected a member of the National Assem-

bly of Hindustan by "the Hindu vote."

"THE FUTURE in Pakistan is as yet uncertain," he continued. "No constitution has been made. We hope for one along the same lines as the Hindustan constitution. We hope the constitution will be fair to us. We plan to continue our work as before."

In order to reach millions of Indian women who still live in purdah (behind a screen), more missionary sisters are a vital necessity in spreading the faith here, Archbishop Kierkeks said. He explained that neither priests nor male doctors are permitted access to these women and he spoke of the great need for Catholic women doctors.

"Another of our most urgent needs," he said, "is for a Catholic medical college, to train doctors and nurses. At present, Catholics must attend non-Catholic institutions to get their training and degrees. We also need more Catholic hospitals."

"But our greatest need is for more native priests. Of the 3,500 Catholic clergy at present in India, 4,000 are natives. We have 3 Catholic nuns totaling 3,500,000. We need many more native priests."
