### CWV Asks New Officer Schools

Milwaukee - (NC) - Catholic War Veterans leaders, in meetings here, have urged Secretary of Defense James Forrestal to request an appropriation of \$100,000,000 for establishment of additional military and naval training schools for regular and reserve officer personnel.

Max H. Sorenson of Philadelphia, national CWV commander, speaking for the organization's joint boards, also urged "each and every American" to take full advantage of the visit of the Freedom Train to their communities. Asking repudiation of what he called Communist party efforts to "sabotage" the train, Mr. Sorenson called upon parents and educators to encourage children to view the historical papers carried on the train.
