

500 in Tribute To Msgr. Cowen At Auburn Fete

Auburn—It was both a solemn and joyful occasion when more than 500 men and women assembled Wednesday evening, Nov. 12 in Lyceum Hall to rejoice with and pay honor to their beloved pastor, Rt. Rev. Msgr. William E. Cowen. The event was another colorful and touching milestone in the history of St. Mary's Church and came as an aftermath of the recent elevation of Monsignor Cowen to his present high church rank by His Holiness Pope Pius XII.

Monsignor Cowen, a native of Auburn, who was invested with the purple robes of his office Tuesday morning during a Solemn Pontifical Mass in the Pro-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, Rochester, by Most Rev. James E. Kearney, bishop of the Diocese of Rochester, is the first Monsignor in the 75-year history of the large and flourishing Clark Street Church, and it was with pride and thanksgiving that the hundreds of parishioners extended greetings at the capacity reception and program.

For the testimonial and program of rejoicing, Monsignor Cowen wore the purple robes of his office. The Girls' Chorus opened the program with a musical welcome, followed by monologue, "Breakfast in Three Scenes," by Mrs. Gerard Lesch, "Paris Angelique" was sung by the Misses Madeline and Patricia Englert, Adolf Huss, a Auburn violinist, played "Scene de Ballet" and Mrs. Allen Shaylor sang "Ave Maria."

FEATURED in the handsome program, in addition to a large photo of the honor guest were the following photo-static copied greetings from Bishop Kearney: "My dear Doctor Cowen: The fine service you have given to Holy Mother Church, both in the seminary and as pastor, has won the esteem of everyone. It is not surprising that His Holiness Pope Pius XII should select you for his domestic prelate. He asks me to greet you as Right Reverend Monsignor. The apostolic delegate, in conveying his message, asks me to add to my congratulations his own sincere felicitations. Fraternally in Christ, James E. Kearney."

Rev. Richard T. Torrey, former assistant at St. Mary's and now associate editor of the Catholic Courier-Journal speaking for the clergy, said: "I consider it a high honor to have been chosen to speak for the 16 priests who have served under Monsignor Cowen.
