### Baltimore and Washington Archbishops Appointed

May 22, 1934, with His Excellency Archbishop Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to the United States, officiating. He was installed by the late Cardinal O'Connell, Archbishop of Boston.

**ARCHBISHOP - ELECT** Patrick Aloysius O'Boyle of Washington has for many years played a distinguished role in organizing and administering the work of Catholic charities, both at home and abroad. For four years he served as Executive Director of War Relief Services N.C.W.C. Last August he was named Executive Director of the great Catholic Charities in the Archdiocese of New York.

A native of Scranton, Pa., he was born July 15, 1890, attended St. Paul's parochial and high school, St. Thomas preparatory school, and St. Thomas College, all in Scranton, prior to entering, in 1910, St. Joseph's Seminary, Yonkers, N. Y.

He was ordained May 21, 1921, in St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York, by the late Cardinal Hayes and served for five years as curate at St. Columba's parish in New York's lower west side. At that time already he became deeply interested in social questions and in 1926 was made executive director of the Catholic Guardian Society.

For two years he studied at the New York School of Social Work and from 1933 to 1936 he was Assistant Director of the child care department of Catholic Charities of the New York archdiocese.

In 1936, he became Executive Director of the Mission of the Immaculate Virgin at Mount Loyello, Staten Island, a home caring for more than 1,000 dependent children. He headed this institution for seven years, and during this time, in 1941, he was named a Papal Chamberlain with the title of Very Reverend Monsignor.

IN AUGUST, 1945, he was appointed Executive Director of War Relief Services N. C. W. C., which under his direction developed into a great world-wide relief agency for the relief of war victims without regard to race, nationality or creed. On June 21, 1944, His Holiness Pope Pius XII created him a Domestic Prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor.

Last July, Archbishop-elect, then Monsignor, O'Boyle was named a Cardinal of the Archdiocese of New York by His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, who had previously appointed him executive director of Catholic Charities.

Bishop-elect Albert Rudolph Zurowaste of Belleville, successor to the late Bishop Henry Althoff, was born April 20, 1901, in East St. Louis, Ill. He studied at St. Francis College, Quincy, Ill., and prepared for the priesthood at Konvik Seminary, St. Louis. After his ordination on June 8, 1924, in Belleville Cathedral by Bishop Althoff, he served as a curate until he was appointed, in 1931, Superintendent

### of St. John's Orphanage

After two years' service there, he was named Superintendent of Central Catholic High School for Boys and in 1940 became pastor of St. Joseph's Church, East St. Louis. Since 1934 he has been editor and manager of The Messenger, weekly journal of the Diocese of Belleville, and since 1934 director of Catholic Charities.

**BISHOP-ELECT** Louis Joseph (Lester) Bradley of the newly-created Diocese of Austin, Texas, was born June 24, 1890, at Piqua, Ohio. He studied at St. Jerome's, Kitchener, Canada, and prepared for the priesthood at St. Mary's Seminary, Cincinnati, and St. Mary's Seminary, La Porte, Texas. December 8, 1918, he was ordained for the Diocese of Galveston by Bishop Christopher W. Byrne at St. Mary's Cathedral in Galveston. In the following year he was appointed Chancellor of the Galveston diocese and, at the same time, named pastor of St. Christopher's Church, Parkplace, Houston, which he had administered in conjunction with his duties as Chancellor, up to the time of his elevation to the hierarchy.

Bishop-elect Wendelin Joseph Nell, Titular of Basima and named Coadjutor with the right of succession to Bishop Byrne of Galveston is a native of Texas. He was born January 18, 1900, in Bonham, Tex. He attended parochial schools in Ft. Worth, Tex., and La Porte, Tex., and studied for the priesthood at St. Mary's Seminary La Porte and at the American College in Rome. He was ordained in the Eternal City, April 11, 1923, in St. John Lateran, for the Diocese of Dallas. Soon after his return to this country, he was named pastor of Christ the King Church in Dallas.

### New Encyclical Warns of Errors

committed the error of forgetting that both the doctrine and practice of the Church evolve over centuries, and that later customs and ideas cannot be ignored.

The Pope urged that the liturgical spirit be promoted through sermons, writings, meetings and congresses. He exhorted the faithful to practice spiritual meditation, to make retreats, to visit the Blessed Sacrament often, to make novenas, and engage in other pious actions. These exercises, he said, are "wonderfully efficacious in the renewal of the spirit."

The aim of the encyclical, Pope Pius stated, was to promote what is good and to check excesses, also to bring about closer unity between the clergy and the faithful as an effective bulwark against doctrines and ideologies that are hostile to the Church.

In the concluding section, the Pope exhorted the hierarchy to use the means it deemed most efficient so that the "clergy and people become a sole mind and body."

### Cardinal Watches Aid Go to 200 Paris Families

Paris (NC) Distribution of food, shoes and other wearing apparel to 200 families in Clichy, a workers' suburb of Paris, by War Relief Services' National Catholic Welfare Conference, took on the character of a grand solemnity.

Besides His Eminence Cardinal Suhard, Archbishop of Paris, and his Auxiliary Bishop Beaussart, among those present were Monsignor Heim, representing the Papal Nuncio, the Rev. William Slattery, Superior General of the Vincentian Fathers throughout the world and Mrs. Jefferson Caffery, wife of the American Ambassador to France.

### Daily Communicant Dies

Oakland, Calif. (NC) Rear Admiral John Jerome Gaffney, who managed the navy's supply system in the Pacific from Pearl Harbor during the war, has died here at the age of 56. Admiral Gaffney was known at Pearl Harbor as a daily communicant throughout the war period.
