

Protestant Cites Need Of Christian Schools

Protestantism (NC) — The only hope of reversing the trend toward secularism in America and its logical outgrowth, the loss of the Christian ideal, is the reestablishment of Christian education.

Protestantism argues that the schools are worthy of public support because: (1) Roman Catholics should not be compelled to pay for two systems of education, and (2) parochial schools are beneficial to the public welfare, since they give the same general education as public schools along with religious instruction.

He adds that apparently the problem of separation of church and state "needs further clarification."

He finds on the other hand that Protestantism, young people from kindergarten to university are spending at least 20 hours a week in institutions that are subjecting them to constant bombardment by an anti-Christian philosophy.

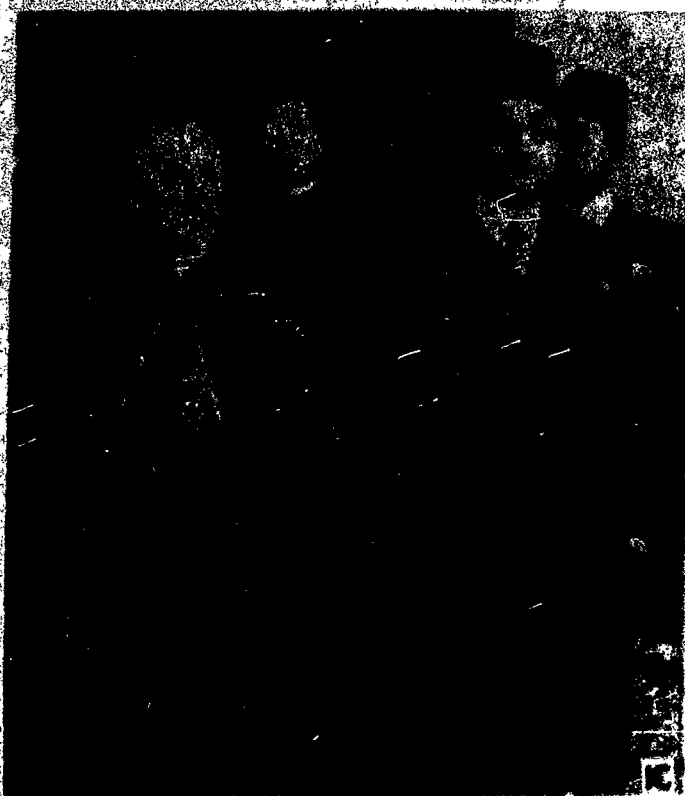
He avers that Sunday schools and religious programs are not sufficient and that the most effective answer to the problem is to establish Protestant systems of education.

THE AMERICAN PROTESTANT church is not alone in its view. The public schools are likely to become a two-faced system, he says. If only 50 per cent of all pupils pass through the Protestant system, it will have a tremendous influence upon American education. Protestant schools will present a genuine challenge to secularism and will offer a superior way of life.

The Christian school will set a deterrent to the contemptuous attitude toward Christianity which characterizes the nation's present education.

Dr. Kian expresses the hope of reversing the tide and the loss of the nation through a return of education to a Christian basis.

Catholic School Tax Defended by Roxas

Manila, (NC) — "One of the most important reasons why democratic ideas have taken such deep root in the Philippines is that the great majority of Filipinos are Catholics," President Manuel Roxas told this correspondent in an exclusive interview in historic Malacan Palace here.

Seated in his book-lined study, the chief executive of the youthful republic of the Philippines voiced his appreciation of the place religion holds in the life of his people.

"I am certainly in favor of having diplomatic relations with the Holy See and would be very happy to establish them," he said, "especially as ours is the only Christian nation in the Far East with a population 90 per cent Catholic."

PRaising the part played by the Catholic Church in the development of the Philippines, he recalled that "it was through the Catholic Church that the Spanish brought the western culture here. The educational contribution of the Church has been very great; she has been instrumental in sowing progressive ideas in the Philippines."

Asked what he hoped would be the Catholic contribution towards the future progress of the Philippines, President Roxas made the following suggestion, which he called "rather revolutionary."

"I believe that Catholics in the Philippines and this includes the clergy should take more interest in social welfare and everyday affairs, rather than confine themselves to purely religious matters. The clergy are in an excellent position to spread progressive ideas on the duties and functions of government and on popular well-being."

"This suggestion is likely to be regarded as revolutionary by many in the Philippines, where religious leaders have been atacked formerly for discussing even those public issues that closely affected religion."

Your correspondent drew his attention to statistics on relief work done by the Church in the Philippines between May, 1945, and August, 1947, when 1,220,591 persons were assisted with relief goods totaling \$1,150,339 (U. S. money). The relief supplies were sent by the U. S. Catholic agency, War Relief Services-N. C. W. C., and were distributed by the Catholic Welfare Organization here.

President Roxas would not discuss the proposal made by Lorenzo Tanada, member of his own party and until recently solicitor general, who has declared that the only way to accomplish "moral rehabilitation" is to permit religious instruction in the public school curriculum. Mr. Tanada is now a candidate for the Philippine senate.

Your correspondent then asked: "If the Philippine legislature were to pass a bill permitting religious instruction in public schools, along the lines of the bill passed by a large majority, nine years ago and vetoed by the late President Quezon, would you veto it, Mr. President?"

"I could not answer that now," was the reply. "I would approve of any religious instruction that did not violate the constitution, but I would not tolerate any strain against the spirit of the constitution."
