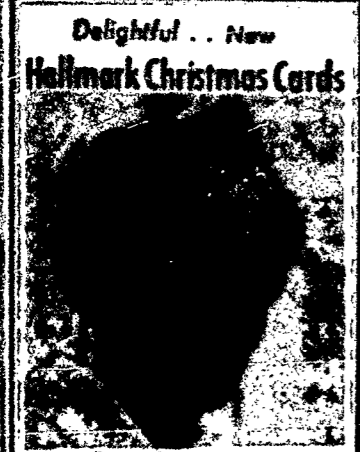


Japan Gets Newman Works

In observance of National Book Week, the presentation was designed to promote more interest in good reading matter.

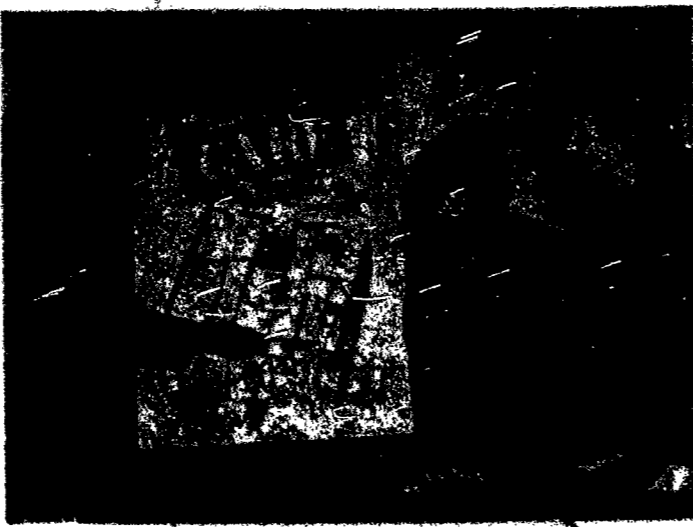
Title of the presentation was "Books in Review."
