CHINA'S RED THREAT CITED

Washington — (NC) — Declaring that the picture of the Catholic Church in China "is too little known in this country," the Rev. Frederick A. McGuire, C.M., executive secretary of the Catholic Welfare Committee of China, pointed out that there are more archbishops, bishops and prefectures apostolic in China than there are in the United States and added that unless Communism there may be eliminated, no generalization."

Speaking in St. Matthew's Cathedral here, Father McGuire related that in the United States we have 120 archbishops and 200 dioceses while China "is divided into 130 archdioceses, dioceses and prefectures apostolic." He pointed out that 24 of these dioceses are under Chinese Army bishops or bishops.

"There are today in China 2,000 foreign priests and 2,348 Chinese priests; 279 foreign brothers and 226 Chinese brothers; 2,137 foreign sisters and 4,296 native sisters," he continued. "There are more than 2,000 parishes and 20,000 mission stations regularly visited by the priests."
