

### Nazareth Seniors Set To Make U. S. Service Test

Twenty-one Nazareth College seniors will take the U. S. Civil Service Senior Professional Assistant examination at the Rochester Post Office on Saturday, Dec. 6.

Among the fields in which the Nazareth students are interested are the Administrative, Technical, and Clerical. The examination will be taken by the successful members of the Chemistry and Patent Examiner tests which the Chemistry majors will try; the Social Science Analyst examination, which is attracting the Sociology and Social Studies majors; the Mathematics major and various tests in the Biological sciences, which will be tried by the Biology majors.

The Junior Professional Examination is the device rolled out by the U. S. Civil Service Commission for recruiting college graduates for Federal jobs. The written tests are recognized as difficult, they are no more so for Nazareth students than for other college graduates. The tests are designed to measure the ability of the applicant to perform the job which he will be expected to do.

In accordance with an executive order issued by the President on February 4, 1944, which requires for specific positions to be established by the Civil Service Commission, appointments may be made only from such lists.
