Communism Seen 'Greatest Threat'

OTTAWA (NC) — Speaking before the Canadian Educational Society here, George Brown, Premier of Ontario, declared today the greatest threat to Canada is the spread of communism based upon atheistic materialism as a threat to civilization as great as the atomic bomb or any material force which man has at his disposal.

He added that the best bulwark against communism is religion, and for this reason, as well as many others, the Ontario Government introduced religious education into public schools three years ago.

In Ontario there are the non-denominational schools, known as public schools, and the Catholic schools, known as separate schools. Both follow the same course of general studies. Religious instruction has always been given in the separate schools, but it was not until three years ago that it was introduced into the public school curriculum by Premier Brown as Ontario Minister of Education.

'Father Brown' An Archbishop

San Francisco (NC) — The "Father Brown" is the last serious story of a convert, "Father Brown" by John Galsworthy, has been identified, according to The Monitor, newspaper of the San Francisco Archdiocese. New Prelates Prepare For Elevations

New York (NC) — Archbishop designate Patrick A. O'Boyle of Washington, D. C. has pledged to serve the priests and faithful in the Archdiocese of Washington with my whole heart and soul, realizing that I am treading on ground made sacred by the saintly Cardinal (James) Gibbons and the venerable Archbishop (Albanus J.) Curley.

The Archbishop-designate expressed his "filial devotion and heartfelt gratitude" to His Holiness Pope Pius XII for the confidence placed in him and said it is "my sincere prayer that, aided by the grace of God" the confidence shall be justified.

THE NEW YORK prelate will be the only member of the present U. S. hierarchy to have been advanced by the Pope from the position of a Monsignor to the rank of resident Archbishop. All other Archbishops were advanced after first having served as Bishops. He also has the distinction of being named the first Archbishop of Washington.

In his new position, Archbishop-designate O'Boyle will be Chancellor of the Catholic University of America. Regarding this, he said: "I have always had a deep respect and love for the Catholic University of America, as a great center of learning. To be Chancellor of this Citadel of Catholic thought and action is indeed a grave responsibility, but a responsibility lightened by the fact that no university or college in this country has a more learned and devoted faculty."

Providence, R. I. (NC) — Bishop Francis P. Keough of Providence, who has been named by His Holiness Pope Pius XII to serve as Archbishop of Baltimore, has disclosed that his installation in Baltimore will not take place until after the first of the new year.

In a press conference, the Archbishop-designate told newspapermen: "After all, I have more to do than just close the books here."

High School Study Fails 60 Pct. of Pupils, Unit Finds

Washington (NC) — The Rev. Bernardine Myers, O.P., president of the Secondary School Department, National Catholic Educational Association, is a member of the Commission on Life Adjustment Education for Youth which concluded its first conference at the U.S. Office of Education here.

The commission acts in an advisory capacity to the federal education body and is working toward a reworking of the nation's high school system.

It was brought out in the commission's conference with the press here that present high school curricula and aimed either at the 20 per cent of students who intend to go to college or at the 20 per cent who concentrate on technical and vocational courses, with the result that the needs of the other 60 per cent are inadequately filled.

Although members of the commission stressed that they were still in the exploratory stage of their work, they indicated their feelings that the study of "Ivanhoe," "Silas Marner" and Milton's "If Penances" in American secondary schools would soon have to be supplemented with courses like "How to Find a Job," "How to Use Leisure Time," and "Home Management."

UNESCO Cooperation Asked
 Washington (NC) — Success of the program of the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization, known as UNESCO, will be assured only when the program is put to work practically in the schools of the participating nations, writes Edgar Frederick C. Hochwald, director of the N.C.W.C. Department of Education, in the November bulletin of the National Catholic Educational Association.
