Dutch Said Ready to Free Indonesians

New York — Holland is prepared to "establish the United States of Indonesia as an independent state within the shortest possible time compatible with ensuring order and safety for its citizens," Dr. Emanuel Baas, vice president of the Catholic People's Party of the Netherlands and a member of the Second Chamber of the Dutch Parliament, said here in an interview discussing the Indonesian question.

"In view of the democratic and progressive character of our Government and the parliamentary majority," Dr. Baas said, "I may say that I am surprised sometimes at the facility with which some parts of American opinion tend to regard the Netherlands policy in Indonesia as that of an old-fashioned colonial power."

Dr. Baas said the attitude of the Catholic Party toward Indonesia is based "on moral principles as well as the inescapable responsibility of the Netherlands for ensuring order and safety for human lives and property in the process of Indonesia's 'peaceful' evolution toward independence."

"I SHOULD like to assure you," he said, "as a member of the Catholic People's Party, which has a majority in Parliament, that there is no discrepancy between the democratic and socially progressive tendencies in our internal policy and our attitude toward the independence of Indonesia. On the contrary, revival of colonialism would find no ground to stand on in our political community."

Dr. Baas was active in the underground during the German occupation of Holland and was imprisoned by them as a hostage for nearly two years. Participating in preparatory discussions for the organization of the United Nations in London in 1945, he proposed a permanent committee of the Assembly. He has been a delegate for the past two years.

Dr. Baas rebuked United States foreign policy, exemplified by the Marshall Plan, as "far from self-justified but inspired by a sense of world-wide responsibility in endeavoring to ensure a self-supporting prosperity in the war-torn countries and to buttress the four freedoms in the world."

"The European reconstruction plan," he continued, "appears as a unique opportunity in the history of Europe to organize the economic cohesion among European countries which otherwise, vitally needed though it might remain only a pious wish for a very long time."

124 Catholic Chaplains Serve Veteran Hospitals

Washington — (NC) — Seventy-two full-time Catholic chaplains and 70 on part-time duty were among the more than 400 clergymen on duty in Veterans' Administration hospitals and homes throughout the United States as of October 1, it was announced here by Chaplain A. J. McKeown, director of the VA's chaplaincy service.

Exiled Bishop's Body Returned

Mexico City — (NC) — Still heavily laden with flowers heaped on it by the faithful as it was taken through the streets of the Mexican capital, the coffin bearing the remains of Archbishop Jose Mora y del Rio was interred in the Dolores chapel of the Cathedral here which preceded the return of the mortal remains of the heroic Mexican Archbishop to his former See marked the end of a 21-year exile. 19 of them in death. The prelate was banished from Mexico under Calles in 1926 and died two years later, being then buried in the San Fernando archdiocesan cemetery in San Antonio, Tex.

Archbishop Luis M. Martinez of Mexico City, this country's primate prelate, offered the Solemn Mass of Requiem in the Cathedral here which preceded the prelate's interment. Archbishop Mora's remains were brought from San Antonio where a Solemn Requiem Mass, at which Archbishop Robert E. Lucy presided, was offered before the coffin departed. Another Solemn Requiem Mass was offered in Toluca, Mex., from which city a group of faithful accompanied the prelate's remains to Mexico City.

U. S. Husbands, Wives Forget Marriage Aim, Priest Says

New York — (NC) — Americans are making the mistake of overlooking the "mutual satisfaction" of marriage and forgetting the primary purpose of "giving life in a love of sacrifice for each other and the human race and for God."

This was the warning given by the Rev. Fred Mann, Kansas Redemptorist retreat master and Cane Conference leader, in his address this week on the Faith in Our Time program. "Suppose we build a wall around any large city you are familiar with," he related, "and in food and supplies, but let no new people come in while those inside enjoy their culture, their education and all the fine things they have. In four or five generations what would we find? A barren, lifeless city. Not just the same large wall and inside it a huge cemetery."

"Something is happening to our civilization that is not good for us or for our country," he continued. "It is not good because too many people love not life but themselves. For them there are too many other things that have become important besides developing wholesome personalities that represent their love and culture."

Many persons today are paying the price in frustration and failure because they have tried to live for themselves only, and not for others according to Christ's plan, the priest explained.

Japanese Priest Freed From Siberia

Tokyo — (NC) — The Rev. Father Iwanaga (Shizu) a secular priest of Nagasaki diocese who served as a soldier in Korea and Manchuria for four years up to the end of the war, has returned from Siberia to his home diocese.

Father Iwanaga spent about one year doing forced labor in the Ukraine but was brought back to Siberia when his health broke down and was there given a month's course in the teachings of communism.
