**Germany Relief Of Kolping Unit Totals Two Tons**

A total of 4,000 pounds of food, clothing and medicine has been sent by the Rochester Kolping Society into the German diocese of Osnabrueck-North and Freiburg in Breisgau, Adolf Rister, 25 Troyer St. president, has reported.

Members of the Rochester Society had agreed to forego exchange of Christmas gifts and cards among themselves this year in order to use the saved money for relief of the needy in the two German areas.

The 64 members of the society, who monthly send an average of 40 packages overseas, support their relief work with treasury money, and with collection and sale of waste paper and rags. They also collect old clothing and such foods as dried peas, beans, flour and fats to include in the packages.
