Discussing women's contributions to Catholic Action in Holland, Dr. Klompe said they come together in small groups, the members of which have the same interests and the same duties.

"For example," she continued, "in a parish, the mother of school children will be brought together for intimate discussion of problems that affect them and their children. Unmarried women or professional women are formed into other groups. It takes time and energy and organization but we find it pays."

At the same time the pamphlet points out that the chief reason for the spread of Protestantism in Latin America is a scarcity of priests.

The pamphlet, fifth in a series giving the addresses delivered at the first Inter-American Catholic Action Week held here in June, 1943, notes as the most prominent Protestant groups in Latin America Adventists, Pentecostals, Methodists, Baptists, Presbyterians, and the Salvation Army which operates in most of the Latin American countries.

The government of Hesse, in the American zone, followed suit when it held a similar ceremony at the reception of Bishop Ferdinand Drisch of Limburg. The Hesse government, however, stated specifically that this did not imply recognition of the Concordat on its part.

These were the first two test cases since the war when the potential application of the important provisions of the Concordat came up for discussion.




