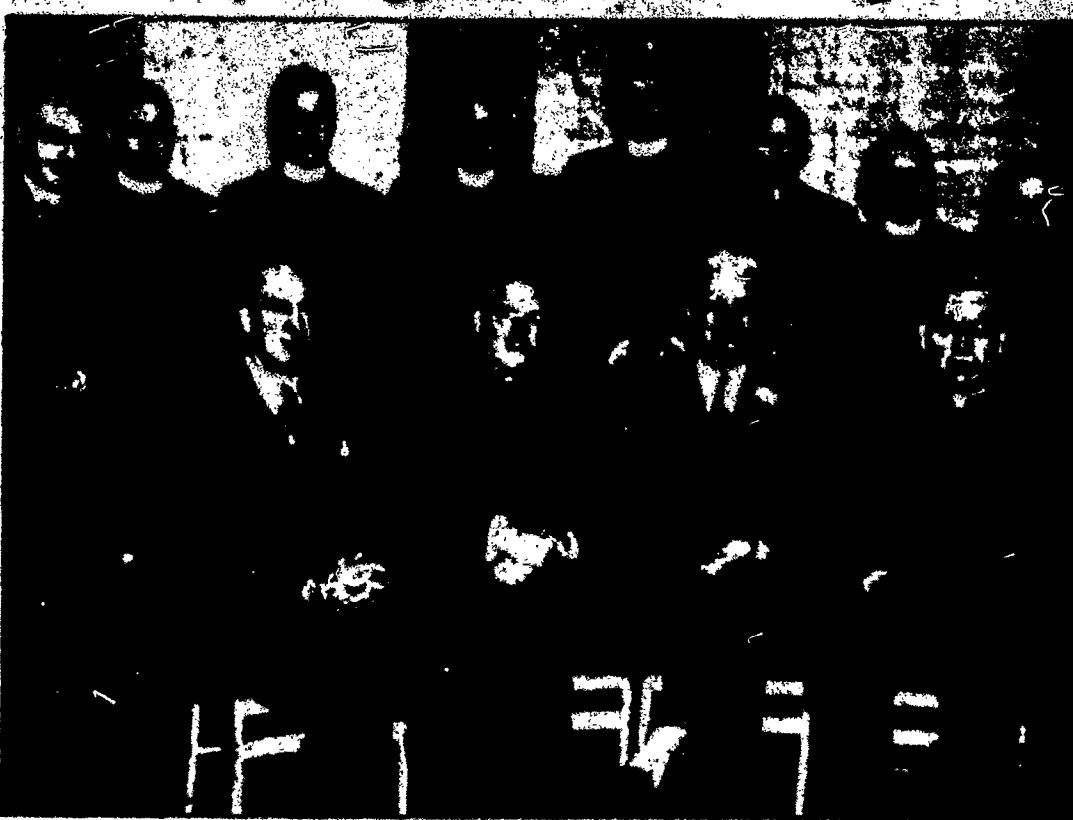

## Clergy, Lay Leaders Prepare For Men's College Campaign

Diocesan clergy and lay leaders were selected this week to head the campaign to raise \$1,047,230 for the new St. John Fisher College.

Although the formal drive to be conducted in every parish in the Rochester Diocese is scheduled for February 12 to 23, preliminary work already is underway.

His Excellency, Bishop Kearney outlined the need for a diocesan college in a series of organizational talks to the clergy and lay leaders during the past week. He pointed to the ideal location of the new college on a 72-acre plot of land purchased by the Basilian Fathers at the intersection of Fairport Road and East Avenue on the southeastern outskirts of Rochester.

GENERAL CHAIRMAN of the campaign is Joseph J. Myler. Twenty-three priests, selected secretary-treasurer of Neilsen Brothers, Inc. and president of the Men of Aquinas. Otto A. Shultz of the Wilson, Shultz & Co., certified public accountants, is chairman of the Special Gifts Committee.

As zone director, he held a preliminary meeting in Rochester Tuesday noon to hear brief talks by Bishop Kearney, Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, V.G., the Very Rev. Hugh J. Haffey, C.S.B., executive director of St. John Fisher and Chairman Myler and Shultz.
