National Press Honor Won by Mercy Student

Miss Madeline Grant of Yonkers, N.Y., a senior at Our Lady of Mercy High School, has been awarded the key honor from the Child and Senior Mystery of Northwestern University. It was announced this week.

Miss Grant, one of nine other students in the entire country to be honored, was recommended by contest judges for her creative ability and depth of feeling in her editorial.

Miss Grant is also competing with other students of Monroe County in the annual Scholastic Press Project, conducted by the Education and Health Association of Rochester and the county.

As part of the first annual Christmas Festival, a Press Project was conducted by the County Health Committee in cooperation with the National Tuberculosis Association and the Columbia Foundation. One hundred participating schools were chosen and invited to the county.

Among the schools entering the contest in addition to Our Lady of Mercy High are: Fairport High, Rush High, Spencerport High, Brighton High and Rochester Academy.
