### Bishop to Give Lenten Series, Open Daily Adoration at St. Joseph's

Daily adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in St. Joseph's Church will be inaugurated by the bishop, Bishop James E. Keane, when he dedicates the church in a special way in the Blessed Sacrament on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 11.

Bishop Keane, who will deliver the Lenten series each Wednesday at St. Joseph's, will continue the inauguration on the high altar immediately following his sermon at 8:30 p. m. Wednesday.

In inaugurating the daily devotion of adoration, St. Joseph's follows a practice common in most of the larger cities during recent years. The Fricklin Street church was chosen as a good downtown location to begin the practice in Rochester.

EXPOSITION will take place each day immediately after the 8 o'clock Mass in the morning. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at 8:30 in the evening with installation of the Holy and Eucharistic.

On Sunday, exposition will begin after the 11:30 Mass and continue through the Holy Hour at 7:30 p. m. Prayers will be recited at all Masses for Communion.

Beginning Ash Wednesday, Bishop Keane will preside at the weekly Mass in the Church of the Diocese Building, 25 Chestnut St. at 8:30 a. m.

Lenten devotional services including adoration, prayer, and meditation will be held in the other city churches at Ash Wednesday and weekly during Lent.

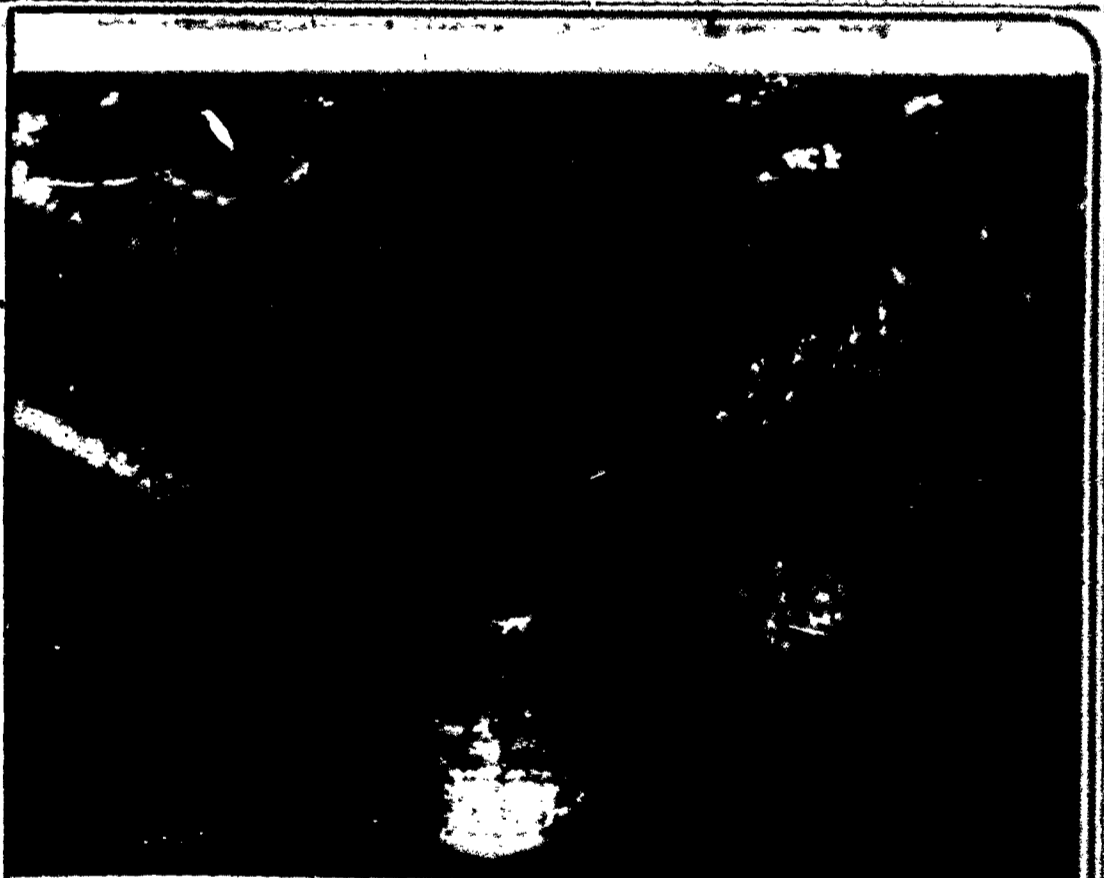
