54 Percent Students for UMT, Aquinas Paper Roll Reveals

Universal military training is approved by 54 percent of students of Aquinas Institute, a recent poll by the M.A. ROON AND WHITE, school publication, showed.

Quoted by representatives of the school paper, the Aquinas boys recorded only 44 percent as opposed to universal military training.

Fifty-one percent of the boys also thought that the program would prevent war, while only 28 percent expressed the opinion that military training would be an impulse to war.

The study that such training would be a benefit to employment or college education, was taken by 44 percent of those polled, as against 36 percent who believed that it would be a detriment.

The poll taken of 170 representative students, revealed that the main reason for approval was preparedness, either in the event of war, or to discourage it.

The Catholic Veterans went on record in approving a bill in New York State Legislature which would require a loyalty oath for school teachers and if any are suspected of Un-American activities, they would be investigated and if found engaged in those activities would be removed from their positions.

The veterans also commended Representative Kenneth B. Keating for introducing into the House his bill calling for an increase in the funds granted to parents for burial of deceased veterans. Keating's bill which would make the grant \$275 instead of the present \$30 would be retroactive to include parents who already have incurred burial expenses for returned veterans.
