Golden Jubilee Marked By Corning K. of C.

Coming — A warning against materialism was sounded by State Deputy William E. Burke of Utica, in his address before members of the Corning Council Knights of Columbus, their wives and guests at the 25th anniversary banquet of the organization held Sunday evening in the K. of C. Room.

Grand Knight J. Colton Marx introduced Toastmaster Paul Tammaro, who in turn introduced Mr. Burke and others at the speakers' table.

Responding to the audience that the purpose of man is to know God, to love Him and to serve Him, Mr. Burke said that man should follow the pattern set for him by God. He urged the need for man in the government who believe in religion or that cooperation may exist between education and religion instead of antagonism.

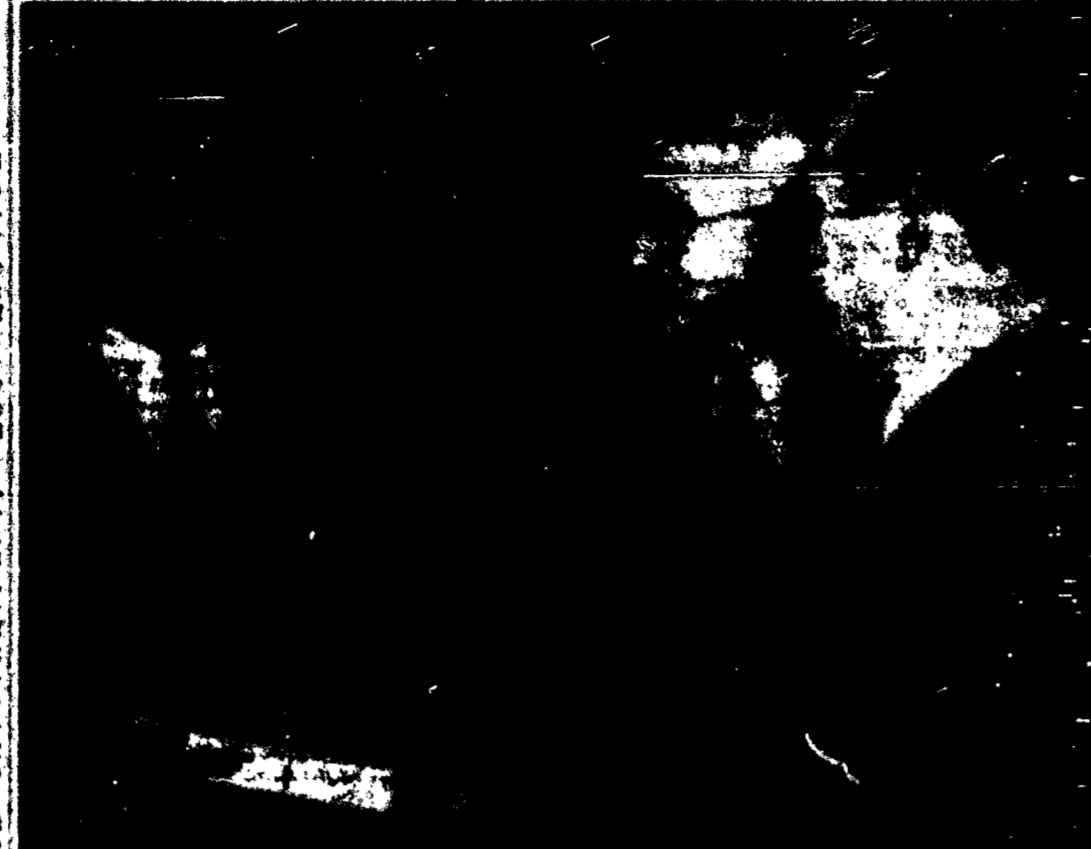

'Red Fascists' Threaten Churches, State Leader Tells Elmira K. of C.

"Red Fascists would turn our churches into stables and nurseries and send the religious to the gallows or before firing squads," was the warning brought by Knights of Columbus State Deputy William E. Burke of Utica to Elmira Council Saturday in an address on "Ours is the Challenge."

The state leader was principal speaker at a testimonial dinner of Elmira knights in Columbus Center honoring District Deputy Eugene F. Agan of Elmira. More than 150 members attended.

District Deputy Agan was presented a gift from Elmira Council by Dr. Louis J. Loflin, grand knight. Attorney Anthony B. Clert was toastmaster.

"Red Fascists would throw us into a barbarism more pagan than before the birth of Christ," State Deputy Burke warned. Mr. Burke said Americans must return to the philosophy of our founders "whereby God is the author and creator of ourselves in His image and the giver of God-given American rights."

He urged all Knights of Columbus members to support a national organization program aimed at "bringing God into government, education and the economic life of America."

The state leader said Red domination of our nation would result in the loss of all freedoms for which our countrymen have shed blood since the 18th century.

"The Reds would turn our churches into stables and nurseries and send the religious to the gallows or before firing squads," the speaker warned. Mr. Burke said tribute to the work of Mr. Agan in local and state Knights of Columbus circles. He pointed out that the El-
