1948 Lenten Regulations

- All the days of Lent, except Sundays, are fast days. The Lenten fast ends at noon on Holy Saturday.
- All persons the age of 14 and 50 years of age are obliged to fast, unless they are sick or infirm, or on a journey, or in a place where fasting would be a hardship, or if they are engaged in a very laborious and exhausting service. Those who fast whether they are married or not should consult their confessor.
- Those obliged to fast may take only one full meal a day. This meal may be taken either at noon or in the evening. The law also permits a light breakfast as well as a light supper at intervals or in the evening.
- During Lent every Wednesday (except the Wednesday in Holy Week, Holy Friday, the second Saturday and Holy Saturday) must have one day of abstinence. However, by special privilege of the Holy See, working people and their families are obliged to abstain from meat only on Ash Wednesday, Fridays and Holy Saturday must have one day of abstinence. Those of the family who are obliged to fast may eat meat at their principal meal; those not obliged to fast may eat meat at any of their meals.
- Those who are exempt from fasting or abstinence during Lent should practice self-denial in some other way.
- In all churches serving as parishes there will be a solemn and beautiful Mass of the Most Blessed Sacrament on Wednesday evening, and the Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings. Prayers in charge of two churches will give a sermon in each church during the week.
- Special parties or similar activities on the church premises are not permitted during Lent.
- The law for carrying out the precept of Penance Commission extends from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday inclusive.

representation. We see it in the days of Charlemagne and of Gregory the Great. We perceive it in the luminous Thirteenth Century on the leopards tongue of St. Thomas Aquinas.

"Not only was Thomas Jefferson acquainted with St. Robert Bellarmine's doctrine of popular sovereignty but he drew from the great Jesuit saint in many instances the identical words which he later wrote into the immortal Declaration of Independence."

JUDGE FEMBERTY stressed that man must not only be intellectual but virtuous, declaring that "no matter what the strength of our army and navy, if religion be permitted to die in the hearts of the people, the end of their glory is at hand." He concluded:

"If education be a training for citizenship, as all will agree, then it must train its proteges to become not only good citizens of this world, but also worthy citizens of the world to come."

Bill to Aid Alien Husbands Backed
Washington—(NC)—The National Council of Catholic Women and the Bureau of Immigration, National Catholic Welfare Conference, have recorded themselves in favor of a bill sponsored in Congress by Representative John Leinski of Michigan, which would grant to alien husbands of American citizens the same non-quota status now extended the alien wives of American citizens.

Bruce M. Mohler, director of the N.C.C.W. Bureau of Immigration, in a letter to the House Subcommittee on Immigration, pointed out that his bureau has favored the enactment of such legislation since 1924. Miss Ruth Craven, executive secretary of the N.C.C.W., in a letter to the subcommittee, expressed the same sentiments.

them desperately. Then the doctors told her that her health wouldn't permit any more children. They warned that another child might mean her life.

Those in the room leaned forward to catch the writer's calm and deliberate speech.

"The doctors were very definite," he continued, "about the risk of another child. But my mother had a lot of confidence in somebody who spells His Name G-O-D. She took the risk and . . . I was born. I was lucky because all the odds were against my chances of ever knowing life . . . I had a chance at life ONLY because my mother took a chance on her life."

None of those in the room had tears in their eyes now. Even the lady who had started it all seemed confused. She dropped her eyes. She could no longer stare at the writer's lips.

"This is why I fight Planned Parenthood," he explained. "I am fighting for that group of anonymous mothers whom we call the unborn. Today the odds against them are terrific and I can't forget that if my mother had believed in Planned Parenthood I would never have been born. And many of you in this room would never have lived if your parents had followed the standards of Planned Parenthood."

THE WRITER CRAP didn't stay at the party. It left as soon as he had told his story. He walked out whistling like a soldier marching off to battle. Those who stayed knew that his cause was noble.
