

### Catholic College Plan In Leader Training Cited

"Are our Catholic colleges training leaders?" was the question chosen for discussion at the second faculty-student meeting of the year at Nazareth College attended by representatives of all classes and campus organizations, as well as members of the lay and religious faculty, Monday evening, Feb. 23.

Miss Elaine Kolesnik, president of the Undergraduate Association, presided and the discussion was led by Miss Anne McLaughlin, a member of the Senior Class. The part played by faculty, senior students and by the students themselves in leadership training formed the basis for the discussion.

Sister Teresa Marie, the Dean of the College, called attention to the fact that every campus activity was really training for leadership. The importance of critical thinking, rather than passive acceptance, in the acquisition of knowledge was stressed.

### Christopher Lynch, Tenor To Sing Here on April 16

Christopher Lynch, popular Irish tenor, will make his first Rochester appearance Friday, April 16 in a concert at Our Lady of Mercy High School auditorium, Blossom Road.

The Irish singer, who made his U. S. debut in the fall of 1946 as tenor star of the "Voice of Firestone" over NBC, is being brought to Rochester through the auspices of Our Lady of Mercy Alumnae Association.

Widely known in concert and radio, Christopher Lynch has also gained a growing following through his RCA Victor Red Seal records.

Born in Rathkeale, Ireland, Lynch studied under Dr. Vincent O'Brien, teacher of John McCormack and later became protegee of the great Irish singer who named him "the one most likely to succeed me."

Upon the death of his friend and critic in September, 1945, he continued his studies in Ireland and in Italy. In America, he started working with the famous veteran singer, Giuseppe De Luca, master of the classic art of Bel Canto.

Most popular of Lynch's numbers are ballads of his native land, which will be included in the program of his Rochester appearance.

In that area, Sister Paulette, head of the Sociology Department at Nazareth College, presided at the opening session.
