First P. A. L. Unit In Parish School At St. Monica's

With the approval of Thomas C. Woods, Commissioner of Public Safety, and the cooperation of the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Gerald C. Lambert, Pastor of St. Monica's Parish, the first Police Athletic League Recreation center has been opened for a Parochial School, with more P. A. L. centers coming later as personnel can be secured.

The first P. A. L. group meetings for the 7th and 8th grade students, who will actively participate in the program was held Feb. 21. The P. A. L. group have planned to hold their weekly recreation meetings on Friday afternoons and all day Saturday in St. Monica's Recreation Hall on Genesee Street where the direction of Policewoman Helen A. The Bureau of Police is doing its best to be a big "PAL" to a lot of little "PALS"—Rochester's school children, through the P. A. L. Recreation Programs, a bureau spokesman said today.

Monsignor Lambert also has hired John McGuckin as a civilian instructor to assist in the P. A. L. program and to direct recreational facilities three nights a week for high school boys of the parish.
