**German Aid Need
 Grows, Kolping
 Society Learns**

An increasing need for material aid is reflected in letters from Germany sent to the Catholic Kolping Society. The society, which has established a professional over-brother societies in the dioceses of Osnabrueck, North and Freiburg in Breisgau in Germany.

The diocesan head of Osnabrueck-North writes that scarce provisions are now being further depleted by the influx of DP's from the East. He says, however, that his people are cheered and strengthened by "the knowledge of having friends in the U. S. A. who understand our need and who wish to help us."

The Rochester Kolping Society collected clothing and food for the needy in the two German parishes. These are sent directly to the priests who distribute them to the families in their parishes. Most of these are DP's who had to leave their homes and belongings behind.

As a means of raising funds, the members of the aid group are collecting paper and rags.
