'Vocation Month' Brings Stories From Missions

Two Sisters of the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary opened the "Vocation Month Campaign" in 12 schools of the diocese this week with a story of world-wide adventure in caring for lepers, orphans and homeless sick in foreign lands.

Mother Mary of the Holy Family and Mother Mary St. Cletus, the first of 10 visiting missionaries who will visit every school in the diocese to spread the story of the vocation-needs of the Church, spoke at the following schools: St. Boniface, St. Monica's, Holy Redeemer, Old St. Mary's, St. Mary's Commercial School, St. George's, St. Theresa's, St. Stanislaus, Holy Cross, St. Theodore and Mercy High.

REPRESENTING 8,500 religious of her community who are scattered in 350 different houses throughout every foreign mission-field, Mother Mary told the children that their greatest work was the care of abandoned babies in China and Japan and India.

"In Australia and India our Sisters are very busy directing leper-hospitals and in Japan we run the large General Hospital of Tokyo," she said.

"But you do not have to be a nurse to join our community," she added, "for wherever we go we have schools, homes for the aged, craft-shops for the natives, and we even run printing presses for our own publishing needs. We welcome girls of any and all capacities and of all nationalities for we have work for all kinds of religious zeal."
