Terming a central office "a long desired progressive step in Holy Name activities," the announcement was released by the Diocesan Union executive committee headed by the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, spiritual director, the Rev. Arthur F. Florack, assistant spiritual director, and Lewis A. Schur, president.

"We are filling a big gap in our Holy Name program with the establishment of a central office," the statement declared. "For several years we have felt the need for a coordinating setup to service the more than 100 parish societies and the more than 20,000 members of the Diocesan Holy Name Society.
