Close to 500 parishioners have signed ballots signifying a desire to join other Catholics throughout the world in the observance of holidays according to the international Gregorian

Under the present setup, Ukrainians following the old calendar do not observ their holidays on the same dates as other Catholics do. Christmas day, for example, falls on January 6.

THE FEAST of Laster Sunday. which varies on each calendar, occurs at the same time in certain years on both, but generally falls anywhere from weeks to months apart because of the difference in calendar. This year Ukrainians will observe Easter

Thus, it is pointed out, Ukrainians who are under obligation to attend Mass and rest from servile work on all holydays, find it difficult to carry out their duties and conform with laws of the Church.

Follow Ideals Of St. Patrick

"The strength of the Irish race is the Faith which has come from Almighty God through St. Patrick. We honor him each year with reverent memory because that faith is so precious a treasure in our lives."

This was the feast day message of the Very Rev. Bernard J. Daly, O.Carm., rector of Whitefriars, the Irish Carmelite monastery in Auburn, in his panegyric at the Solemn Pontifical Mass marking the anniversary of St. Patrick in the patronal church, Plymouth Ave. North, on Wednesday morning.

His Excellency Bishop James E. Kearney, celebrated the Pontifical Mass which was attended by members of Irish-American organizations, Mothers of the St. Monica's Guild and St. Patrick's parishioners.

"ST. PATRICK won the faith or us from God," Father Daly declared, "only by extreme sacrifice and long prayer. If we ask him for help for ourselves and for the troubled world, he will point to his own life of suffering nd perseverance as a model of rue Christian trust in God." Telling the ancient stories of


