### World Periled By Unbelief 300 Adoration Men Told

"The men who will not be ruled by religion will be ruled by tyrants," the Rev. Leo C. Mooney, spiritual director, told 300 members of the Rochester Nocturnal Adoration Society, Sunday morning in discussing the appalling difficulties caused by unbelief in the world today.

The address was given at the annual Communion Breakfast of the Nocturnal Adoration Society which followed Mass and Corporate Communion at St. Patrick's Church, Plymouth Ave. North where the layman, each month keep an all-night vigil before the Blessed Sacrament exposed.

"The repudiation of Christ's teaching inevitably leads to the 'Tyrant State,'" Father Mooney stated.

"Nothing but a religious revival can re-integrate a dying civilization that is born, as all great civilizations have, been born, in an age of religious faith, because the end of atheism is death," he continued.

"WHEN MEN CEASE to believe in God, they cease to believe in themselves. When religion dies, man loses his belief in the significance and meaning of life."

The speaker declared that secularism and irreligion have not made men good.

"There can be no social progress in an age when religion is disappearing," he said.

"Catholic churches are full today not because Catholics are promised Utopia on earth, but because Catholics are reminded that the inescapable sufferings of this life are as nothing compared to the happiness which God has prepared for those who love Him."

Reporting that 7,000 hours of adoration were made by 770 men during the past year, Secretary Joseph W. Benn called upon the members, each to get one new adorer during the coming year. Pointing to the world condition today, he said, "There is very little time to get these hours of adoration and reparation in. Men who have worked successfully on campaigns for needed funds should be as successful in enrolling men for needed spiritual treasures."

**THE SECRETARY** suggested a spiritual treasury to be offered to the Immaculate Heart of Mary that her intercession be effective in the conversion of Russia.

President Theodore W. Houck declared it the duty of each member to "bring in one adorer this year." David Gales, third vice president of the Society presided at the breakfast.

Other officers in attendance were Joseph J. Attinas, first vice president; Rudolph C. Schwenzler, second vice president; James V. Taylor, recording secretary; Sylvester G. Englert, Treasurer and Frank A. Sexton, marshal.

The Society will mark the annual Holy Hour at St. Patrick's on Holy Thursday night at 10 p. m. and will keep the monthly vigil, Saturday, March 28.
