School Ruling Deplored at K. C. Breakfast

Ithaca — The Supreme Court decision in the Champaign, Ill., religious education case is a reincarnation of the theory of complete secularism. John W. MacDonald told members of Ithaca Council 277, Knights of Columbus, and the Holy Name Society of the Church of the Immaculate Conception at a Palm Sunday Communion breakfast.

MacDonald, professor of law at Cornell and executive director of the New York State Law Revision Commission, said that the fundamental philosophy behind the decision leaves him feeling "pretty melancholy and pretty depressed."

Catholic will not be too badly off because of the decision, Professor MacDonald said, because the faith is transmitted, primarily through the church and home. "We aren't going to suffer. The only ones who will suffer are the children of those 70,000,000 Americans not affiliated with any church."

"THESE CHILDREN," Professor MacDonald, a Fourth Degree knight, said, "will grow up without any conception of their purpose in life, what they live for." The decision has taken the word God out of their lives, he added. Professor MacDonald said that

on strictly legal grounds it was his opinion that the decision was probably correct, and then warned that one vote in the court could change the decision upholding the use of public school buses by parochial school children.

If the decision is carried to logical extremes, MacDonald said, it will mean there will be no chaplains for the armed forces or in prisons, "no clergymen to accompany a condemned man to his execution."

"If God and His law are to be ousted from our law and our nation," he said, "then God help us, because one day people will be crying to someone for some kind of mercy."

Communion For 12 Converts

Twelve converts, who were formally received into the Catholic Church last Sunday afternoon in St. Peter and Paul's Church, Elmira, will receive their first Holy Communion there on Easter Sunday.

The new Catholics, who had been under instruction for nine weeks, were received at impressive ceremonies conducted by the Rev. Joseph G. Merkel, their instructor. Assisting were the Rev. William J. Naughton, pastor of St. Peter and Paul's Church, and Rev. Thomas J. Florack, assistant pastor.

The convert class was launched under the patronage of St. Francis Xavier Cabrini on January 25, at the same time that a new novena in honor of Mother Cabrini was begun in the parish.

AT THE BEGINNING of the novena, a request was circulated that fifty people, who had never made the novena or had not made it recently, attend the services and pray for the convert class. Success of the appeal was attested by the fact that many who had never before made the novena, began attending weekly services.

The prayers of these people to the first American saint have been credited with bringing about the twelve conversions. In addition to the converts, four Catholics attended the classes, three times a week, to renew their knowledge of the Faith.

The Mother Cabrini novena, a perpetual novena begun at St. Peter and Paul's in March, 1946, has had for a general intention increased conversions. Since its inception, approximately 75 converts have been received into the Church.
