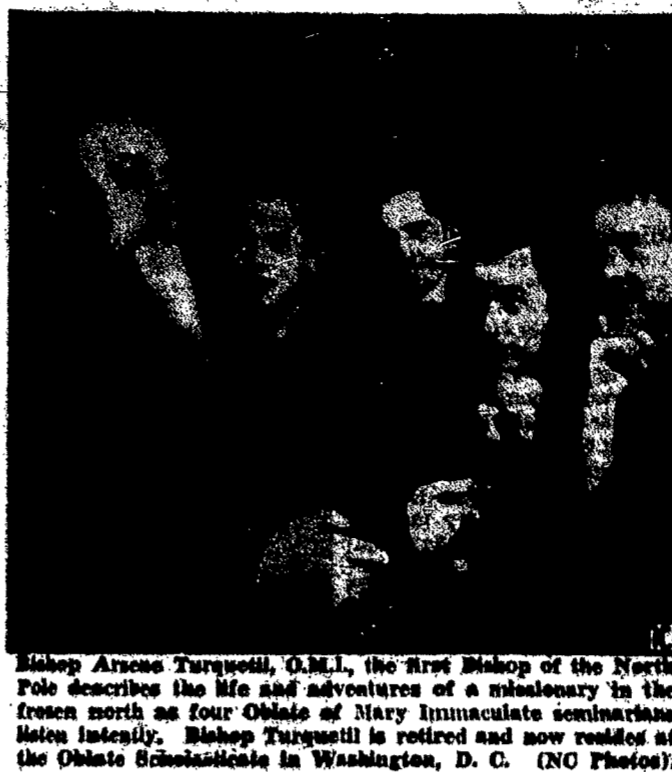

 ARCHBISHOP McNicholas said that while the nation guarantees freedom of education with the right of all parents to select the school of their choice, secularists, legislators, courts and the unscrupulous insist that the educable child must attend a taxpayer school unless his parents or generous persons pay for his education in other schools. Some legislators, he said, contend all other schools are duplicating the work of the public schools.

Dublin — (NC) — Touching scenes were witnessed here when nearly a 100 Austrian boys and girls, guests of the Irish Red Cross Society for the past four months, took their leave of Ireland. Many of the children wept as they bade good-bye at Glencree, County Wicklow, where they stayed.
 On leaving they were to leave Ireland, a large number of the youngsters appealed to be allowed to remain, but their pleas had to be refused because arrangements have been made by the Red Cross for another group of 170. Some of the more daring even tried to hide so that they might not be discovered when the "call up" came for home.

Despite the silence that has been enforced on the men in the area of the dock, this correspondent managed to obtain an incomplete check list of the known items aboard the Chukotka. It revealed that enough industrial equipment is being taken to Odessa on the Black Sea to build what one authority called "a little Pittsburgh."
 The following are but a few of the scarce items being shipped to Russia:

FOUND FOR ODessa is a 335,550 pound shipment of materials for a high speed solid steel frame forging press, complete with electrical equipment and spare parts.
 Also destined for the same port is a cooling bed for a seamless steel tube mill, weighing 175,290 pounds.
 There is a great amount of material destined for the railroad at Murmansk in the north. One item is a specially designed machine for milling steel. It was shipped in three boxes weighing a total of 555,850 pounds.
 There is a complete set of oil drilling equipment and spare parts in fifty-six boxes, thirty-eight crates, and nine separate pieces — all carefully packed. Total weight in hard-to-get steel: 134,103 pounds.
 Other equipment includes a trio of straight bevel roughers, plus four blades, weighing 25,778 pounds; a straight bevel Revex rougher and a bevel Revex cycle machine, weighing 12,970 pounds and 49,800 pounds respectively; another straight bevel rougher weighing 38,770 pounds and a 40,680 pound brazing furnace for the manufacture of steel tubes.

For the Russian port of Vladivostok, a few moments from the shores of Japan by fast bomber, the Chinese carries five boxes of parts for a push-type roll-drawn steel furnace weighing 49,640 pounds, and 101 boxes containing 4,844 pounds of station machines.
 One of the watchmen in the area remarked to me after I had climbed to his tower: "I only hope to God that these things don't come back the way the Japs returned the scrap iron!"

Abp. McNicholas Disputes Taft

 Archbishop McNicholas quoted as follows:
 "You ask me whether it is my reasoning that private schools are needlessly duplicating the needs of the public schools. Yes, this is my position. I think the state should offer to educate all the children, and that it is unnecessary for others to provide that service unless the children or their families wish to pay for the service themselves."
 THIS POSITION of Senator Taft is in conflict with the unanimous decision of the Supreme Court on the freedom of education guaranteed in the Oregon case, the Archbishop indicated.

(When the attempt was made to make all Oregon schools public schools, the Supreme Court declared: "The fundamental theory of liberty upon which all governments in this Union repose excludes any general power of the State to standardize its children by forcing them to accept instruction from public teachers only.")
 This freedom of education guaranteed by the Supreme Court is threatened by widespread movement to frustrate the Archbishop warned. "It has been hard for us to think that Senator Taft favors this frustration. We can arrive, however, at no other conclusion," he stated.
 "It is to be regretted," the Archbishop added, "that a man as capable as Senator Taft should have a closed mind in the field of education. Whether he realizes it or not, he is working against freedom of education, and he is aiding those who wish to frustrate that freedom."
 Archbishop McNicholas is Chairman of the Episcopal Administrative Board of the National Catholic Welfare Conference and president of the National Catholic Educational Association.
