Holy Name Unit Calls Meeting To Plan Parish Softball League

Plans for the Parochial School Softball League will be completed at a meeting Friday, Apr. 16, at 8 p. m., in Parlor A, Columbus Civic Centre. It was announced this week by the league sponsors, the Rochester Deaneiry Holy Name Union.
All priests in charge of parish teams are urged to attend this meeting, at which all details of league operations will be discussed. If the priests are unable to be present, they are urged to send a parish representative, since all matters of scheduling and playing fields will be outlined.
The league will be divided into four divisions this year. This will shorten the schedule so as not to conflict with school examinations. It also will facilitate transportation of teams to playing fields.
MORE THAN 30 grammar schools are eligible for the league. Division pennants and the championship trophy will be awarded by the Deaneiry Holy Name Society, in cooperation with the Rochester Police and Rochester Firemen's Holy Name Societies. League details will be handled by John T. Nothnagle, Arthur P. Farren and Charlie Burgess. Senior students at St. Andrew's Seminary are expected to serve as umpires.
Division winners in the league in 1946 were St. Anthony's and St. Francis Xavier, with the former team grabbing the championship trophy. Last year's champions were the peppery boys from St. Monica's, who beat out Holy Cross and Our Lady of Mt. Carmel in the playoffs.
Twenty-four teams played in three divisions last year. Additional teams are expected this year. Last year's participants included Nazareth Hall, Holy Apostles, Holy Family, St. Monica, Holy Rosary, St. Anthony, St. Lucy, St. Augustine, St. Ambrose, St. Francis Xavier, St. John the Evangelist, Blessed Sacrament, St. Andrew, Mt. Carmel, Corpus Christi, St. Boniface, Sacred Heart, Holy Redeemer, St. Stanislaus, Holy Cross, St. Bridget, St. Michael, Our Lady of Perpetual Help and St. Margaret Mary.
