Father J. Gabro Named Assistant At St. Joseph's

Transfer of the Rev. Jaroslav Gabro to assistant pastor of St. Joseph's Church, Rochester, from assistant pastor Immaculate Conception Church, Hamtramck, Mich., is announced this week by the Rev. Esau Turula, pastor at St. Joseph's.

Father Gabro succeeds the Rev. Joseph L. Szauska who has been transferred to Detroit by the Most Rev. Constantine Homanecy, bishop of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Diocese who made the appointment.

Born in Chicago July 31, 1910, Father Gabro received his early education in Chicago and attended St. Procopius College near Chicago. He studied later at St. Joseph's College, Hamtramck, Conn., and made his theological studies at Catholic University for four years.

He was ordained Sept. 27, 1943, at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Philadelphia, by Bishop Bonachovsky.

Following ordination he was assistant at St. Vladimir's Church in Saratoga, Pa. In July, 1946, he was named pastor of St. Joseph's Church, St. Joseph's, Mo., and in February, 1947, was transferred to Hamtramck.

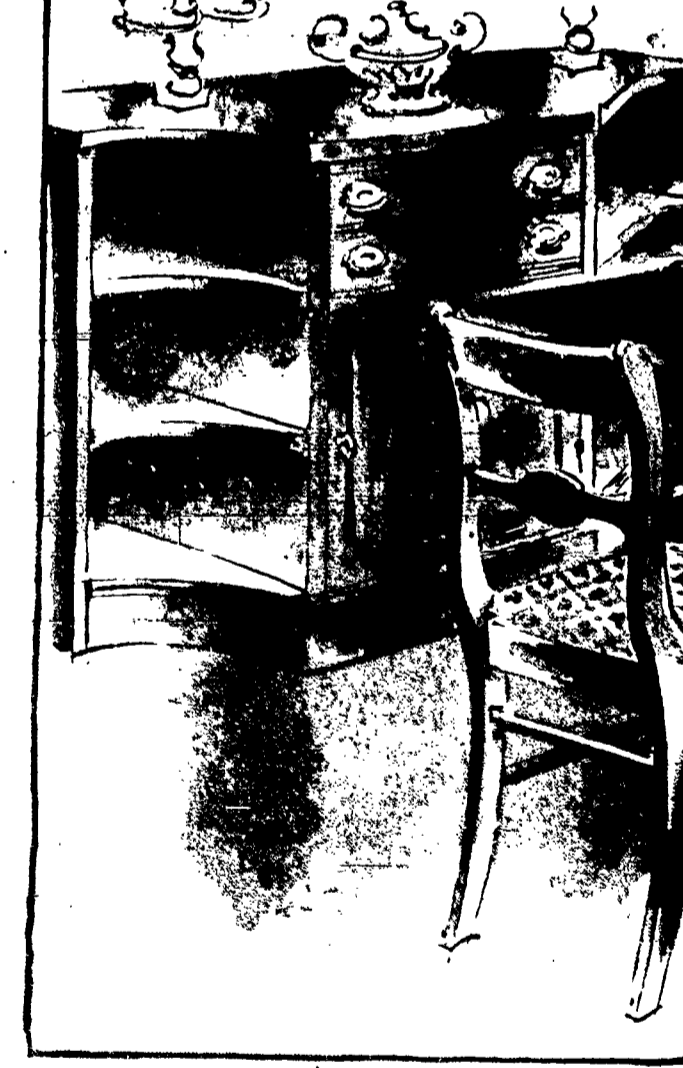
