Kites To Fly On April 18 In Dansville K. C. Contest

Dansville — As a youth project, Dansville Council, Knights of Columbus has inaugurated an annual kite-flying contest, third of which is scheduled for Sunday, April 18.

The event is open to all children from the first grade through high school, in both Catholic and public schools. Clergymen of different creeds not only support the event but encourage youth in their charge to take part.

Norbe C. Blum, publicity chairman of the Kite Contest states that the council believes that the delinquent problem goes back to the parents. With that in mind two rules govern the Dansville event. First the parent must help build the youngster's kite and second, the parent must fly it with the child as a team on kite day.

THE CONTEST is run off in age groups. Prizes are awarded for construction, speed, height and distance flown. Aerial judging will be done from the Gannett Newspaper helicopter.

Tents are used, one for the prizes, another for the construction judges, registration for the press and a kite hospital where "cracks-ups" are repaired. A refreshment stand is handled by the Knights of Columbus Auxiliary with proceeds used to defray part of the expenses for the auxiliary's Teen-Age Dance program during the year.

The community of Dansville joins in supporting the kite-flying youth project. Last year, according to Blum, nearly \$700 worth of prizes were distributed. The greater part of this was underwritten by the council itself and by individual members. Unsolicited donations were made by all the service clubs of the town as well as by many individuals connected with the knights.

Dansville knights are willing to share their experience with others and any information regarding their successful kite-flying contest may be had from Chairman Blum, deputy grand knight.
