### Good Example Influence Stressed to Owego Men

Owego — "You Catholic men by your actions and conduct set an example not only for the younger men in your own immediate families but also for all the men of your community." This was the thought, expressed in different strains by the three guest speakers at the first annual Communion breakfast of the Holy Name Society held Sunday.

More than one hundred men had attended the 8 o'clock Mass in a body and received Holy Communion on the regular monthly Communion Sunday.

Following the Mass nearly 80 of them marched from the church to the Green Lantern Inn where the breakfast was served.

Erwin Baier, vice-president of the society acted as toastmaster and introduced the other officers of the club, Emory Mullen, president, and Edmund J. Morton, secretary-treasurer.

The first speaker introduced was Walter L. Reihan, City Judge of the City of Binghamton and a past Grand Knight of Binghamton Council, Knights of Columbus. Judge Reihan spoke of his work in the courts and the influence of religion and religious training on the youth. He congratulated the members on the large number in attendance and he said he felt that it was one of the great honors accorded him to be asked to address the group.

Toastmaster Baier introduced Attorney Robert O. Brink of Binghamton and District Attorney Brink speaking on "A World without Religion" referred to the address made by Pope Pius XII on Easter Sunday when he referred to the coming election in Italy and said how the eyes of the entire world were upon the outcome of that election.

In speaking of the spread of Communism, Attorney Brink called attention to the fact that no one can serve two masters. In this instance one master is for peace and union and the other is for the world, the flesh and the devil. He stated that in the Catholic Church's fight for freedom from communism all right thinking Protestants and Jews were fighting along with her and for those principles. In referring to Catholic Action, Attorney Brink said that that was only the every day lives and conduct of the well-trained and faithful Catholic which taught by example to follow men, the teachings and beliefs of the Church.

### Nazareth Professor Listed In Family Life Address

Impetus to the work being done in Immaculate Conception Parish to focus attention on the importance of family life will be given at the meeting planned for Wednesday, April 21. The Rev. Edward Lintz, Ph.D., psychology instructor at Nazareth College will speak.

Doctor Lintz, formerly of Aquinas Institute faculty, will discuss "Obedience and How To Command It," at the meeting opening at 8 p. m.

The gathering for Immaculate Conception parishioners is sponsored by the newly formed Family Guidance Group which is seeking to enroll all parents in the parish in their movement.

ORGANIZED experimentally last year, the group is designed to advance the welfare of children through an exchange of information and ideas. The program provides for monthly meetings in the parish hall.

Alternate meetings are for discussions of general problems of the members and for addresses on phases of child guidance to be given by specialists.

In letters to parishioners urging them to enroll in the group, the committee in charge describes the purpose of the organization as "to learn how to best prepare children to meet life creditably." It is pointed out that the experiences of parents in one family may help others find the solution of problems.
