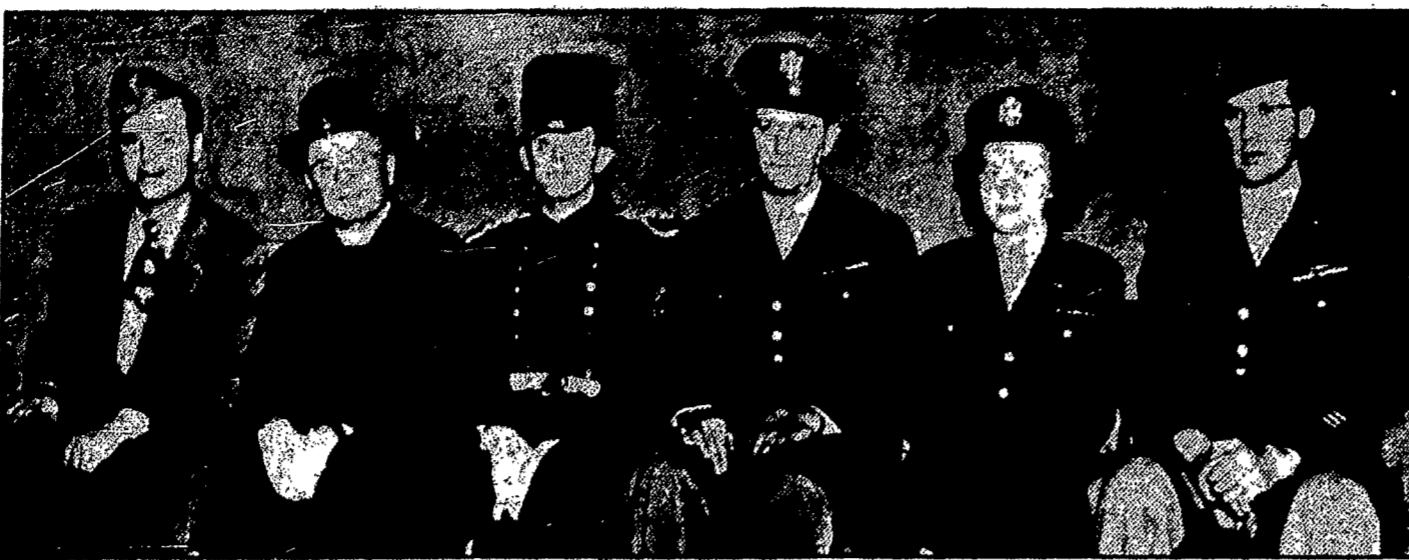

2 Ex-Nurses Now Maryknoll Nuns, Pacific Bound

Two Rochester nurses, now Maryknoll Sisters, took part in a departure ceremony April 18, at the Maryknoll Motherhouse, Maryknoll, N. Y., prior to their sailing for the Philippines and Hawaii in May.

They are Sister Camille Marie who will go to the Philippines, and Sister Maria Nikolai leaving for Hawaii. Both made their First Profession of Vows on March 7.

Most Reverend, Raymond A. Lane, Superior General of the Maryknoll Fathers, presided at the ceremony. He presented the Sisters with their mission crucifixes, gave the blessing and delivered an address.

After a short visit to their homes, the Sisters are due to sail from the Pacific Coast in May.

Sister Camille Marie, the former Miss Mary Lois Black of St. Patrick's parish, Danville, is a graduate nurse of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing, Elmira. Her parents are Mr. and Mrs. Paul Duncan Black of 22 Pine St., Elmira.

Sister Maria Nikolai was State Supervisor of Nurses for the Rochester district, before entering Maryknoll. The former Miss Margaret Whalen of Sacred Heart parish, Rochester, she also had many years experience with the Henry Street Visiting Nurse Service. Her sister, Mary T. Whalen lives at 491 Lexington Ave., Rochester.

For the first time in Rochester the Noble Degree of the Holy Cross, highest degree conferred on members of the Knights of St. John, will be exemplified at St. Joseph's Church Sunday afternoon, May 9.

His Excellency Bishop James E. Kearney, D.D., Supreme Spiritual Adviser of the Knights of St. John, will confer the degree on a class of 100 candidates.

In addition to the Rochester members, the class will also consist of Knights from Syracuse, Utica and Albany.

Following the ceremonial, a banquet will be served at Hotel Seneca. The event is being arranged by the Rochester Regiment's Ritualistic Committee of which A.D.C. Louis J. Hofmayer is chairman.

Dansville Ladies Set Mother's Day Dansville - Affiliation of the Dansville Knights of Columbus Ladies Auxiliary with the National Council of Catholic Women has been announced by the Auxiliary.

The decision followed a report on the NCCW conference April 13 in Horsham, Pa., presided over by Mrs. Norba C. Blum, Mrs. Charles Muldoon, Mrs. Edward Burke and Mrs. Marjorie Hanagan, who represented Dansville auxiliary.

Other local Catholic Societies were also represented. Affiliation brings the auxiliary under the Horsham Diocesan Council, NCCW, under the Rev. John Coonan.
