(Continued from Page 1) MURPHY was equally outspoken in favoring proposed legislation which will outlaw the Communist Party. "We are in favor of outlawing the Communist Party for a long time," he said. "We do not agree that legislation against the Communist Party will drive Communists underground because the real Communists are already underground. The known Communists who appear on the surface are only the fronts. The real dangerous Communist agents are already underground," he said. Recalling that the Department of Justice has testified that the Communist Party advocates violent overthrow of government, Murphy charged that the Communist Party is not an ordinary political party but a political conspiracy which is actually guilty of treason. On the eve of the convention's opening, the Monroe County Chapter of CWV passed unanimously a resolution calling for the passage of the Mundt Bill now being discussed in Congress. This bill would make registration with the Justice Department obligatory on all Communists, bar them from government office, and make illegal all activity aimed at establishing a foreign-controlled government in the United States. THE CONVENTION sessions open this evening (Thursday) with a civic meeting in the Powers Hotel at which Councilman Henry L. Schleuter will extend the city's welcome to the 1500 visiting delegates. Women's Council Urges DP Bill

Albany, Ga. (NC) — A resolution urging Congress to pass appropriate legislation immediately for the admission of displaced persons to this country and to adopt the Wiley bill with revisions deemed necessary by private agencies was passed by the Savannah-Atlanta Diocesan Council of Catholic Women at their convention here. Among changes advocated by the women's group in the Wiley bill are an increase of the number of DP's from 50,000 a year for two years to 200,000 for two years, and a screening of DP's to deny entry to those who advocate overthrow of our Government by force. Election of officers or state commander and other posts will occupy Saturday afternoon. Guest speakers will be Congressman Kenneth B. Keating, Col. David P. Page and Joseph P. O'Hern state VA administrators from New York City.

Schools Here Help China Orphanage

The children of the Elementary schools in the Diocese of Rochester have contributed \$1,500 toward the erection of an orphanage in Nanking, China, according to the report of the Very Reverend John S. Randall, Diocesan Director of the Propagation of the Faith. Each year, during the Holy Season of Lent the boys and girls participate in a special mission project. They have built five chapels in mission lands and have established a bourse for the training of a Chinese seminarian and one for a Japanese seminarian. This year the children bought paper bricks at three cents. The paper bricks symbolized the contribution of the school children to mission building in China. The proceeds will be sent to the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary who have undertaken the construction of a Nursery, Home and Orphanage in Nanking, China. The proposed construction includes: a Nursery; a Nursery School for little tots from the age of two to six years; a Primary School; a School of Art and Crafts. All the children will receive special training in Domestic Science to prepare them for their future role in life. It is estimated that \$30,000 is needed to cover the cost of the bricks alone to complete the structure. The three schools contributing the largest amount of money were Holy Family and St. Andrew, Rochester, and St. Mary, Elmira. Special recognition is given St. Joseph's School, Rochester, for their contribution of \$75. With 119 children registered the average contribution was 63c per capita.

Alleged Red-Run Schools Raided By Montreal Police

Montreal — (NC) — Two night schools, alleged to be centers of Communist teaching, have been raided by the Montreal police anti-subversive squad and literature and books said to be Communist in nature seized. Authorities here have placed the matter before the Attorney General of Quebec for a decision on what action should be taken as a result of the raids. Both halls were said to be centers for children of Ukrainian descent. When police raiders arrived at one of the halls a class had just started, and there were 12 children present, ranging in age from eight to 13 years. They were reported to be one group of a total of 25 children who attended the classes on two different nights. Questions revealed that the children were being taught what Russia had done in the Ukraine, all of course favorable towards Russia. Books seized dealt with the Russian revolution. This school is believed to have been in operation for between one and three years, but it was only during the week of the raid that the anti-subversive squad of the Montreal police had learned about its existence. According to information given to the police, the children had a band, and two of the specially favored numbers were entitled, "Stalin, My Hero," and "The Red Army March."
