**Central Office Study Planned At HNS Meet**

Methods of operating the new central office of the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union to best service the more than 100 affiliated societies throughout the diocese will be discussed at the 15th annual convention of the Union, scheduled Sunday, May 16, in St. Mary's Church Hall, Elmira.

Approximately 500 delegates are expected at the session, which will open promptly at 3 p. m. and will close promptly at 5 p. m. with the celebration of Benediction. Delegates and their wives have been invited to a buffet supper at 6 p. m. in the Mark Twain Hotel.

A nationally known lay speaker will address the convocation, according to Lewis A. Schur, Diocesan Union president. Schur urged all parish Holy Name units to make certain their societies are represented at the convention, as very important business is to be discussed. Some parish societies will provide travel expenses for their delegation.

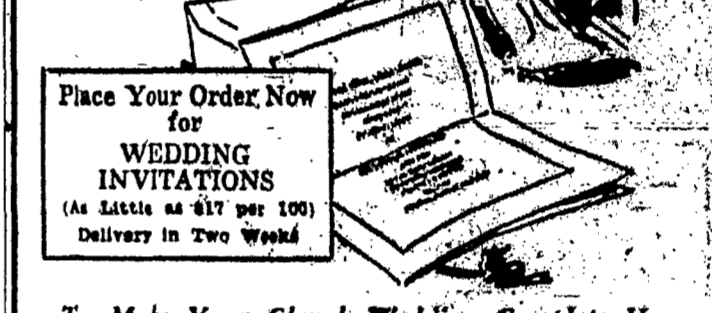

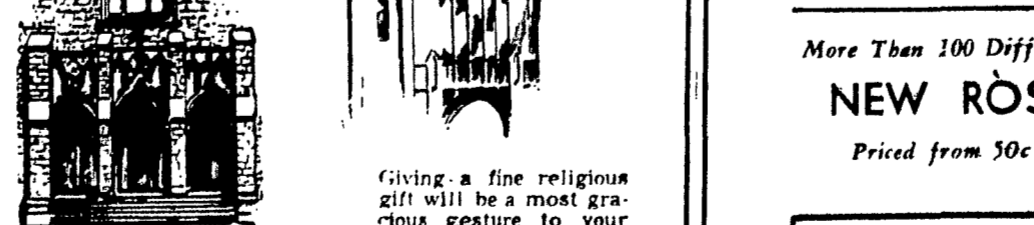
