Malta Knights Advanced As Holy Land Guardians

London — (NC)—A revival in some way of the great military-religious orders of crusading times was suggested in British Catholic circles as one possible solution of the problem of defending the holy places in Palestine when the British withdraw on May 15.

This suggestion is considered to be in line with the proposal by His Eminence Bernard Cardinal Griffin, Archbishop of Westminster, to Ernest Bevin, British Foreign Secretary, to send a defense force "composed of earnest Christians of any denomination from all nations willing to cooperate" to Palestine to protect the holy places in Jerusalem and Nazareth.

The Knights of Malta, those gallant guardians of Our Lord's homeland, began in Jerusalem but moved successively to Rhodes and to Malta, which they left 150 years ago. But their structure, their skeleton formation, has continued in existence, in Britain at any rate, as a heraldic and charitable society. If the right men could be found, the Knights of Malta and other military orders of similar type, could play a great role again. It is declared here.

ANOTHER SUGGESTION made here is that the proposed international force to police Jerusalem after the British withdrawal might be recruited not by the somewhat arbitrary methods likely to come from the United Nations but by, or from, the countries which still have traditional religious interests there — the French preeminently, the Greeks and the Italians; with, of course, units also provided by the Moslem and Jewish communities.

The British conscience is very definitely troubled by the almost insoluble problem, for which the British Government more than any other power is responsible. This is shown again and again in the House of Parliament where men of no known religious leaning prod, with a Christian sub-consciousness, at the growing uneasiness which remains after the Government has so determinedly announced its decision to be quit of the whole affair by May 15.

MAJOR C. E. MOTT-BADCLIFFE, Conservative, said in a recent debate, for instance: "It is in my view a very bitter condemnation of twentieth-century Christendom that apparently, in spite of the Christian nations who sit on UNO, no effective steps can be taken to prevent"

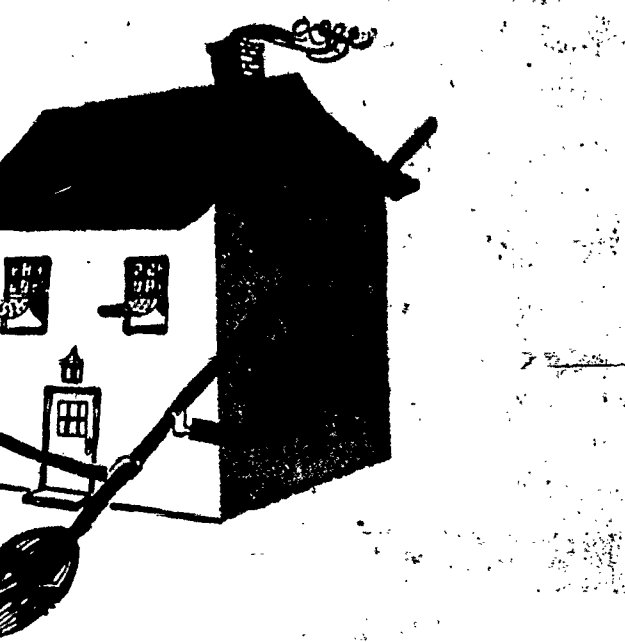
