12 County Parishes Join In Holy Name Paper Drive

Twelve Monroe County parishes will participate this Saturday, May 15, in a collection of old newspapers and magazines sponsored by the Rochester Deanery Holy Name Society.

Parishioners have been requested to bring the papers to the parish halls on Saturday before noon. Trucks will stop at the parishes in the afternoon to pick up the load. Parishes in this week's drive are: St. Leo's, Hilton; St. John's, Evangelist's, Spencerport; Church of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Brookport; St. Vincent de Paul's, Churchville; St. Fechan's, Chili; Good Shepherd, Henrietta; St. Joseph's, Rush; St. Paul of the Cross, Honeyoye Falls; St. Catherine's, Mendon; St. Jerome's, East Rochester; St. Joseph's, Penfield; Holy Trinity, Webster.

Officers of the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union again this week expressed appreciation to the men in the more than 30 parishes which so far have participated in the countywide paper collection. Several additional parishes have set collection dates in June. Purpose of the campaign is to provide for additional services through the new Holy Name central office.

With many parishes requesting different dates than those originally scheduled, Arthur P. Farren, Holy Name executive secretary handling drive details, announced that a new schedule of collection dates will be published next week. No parish need feel bound to the originally-scheduled date, he added.

Collections scheduled on May 29 — which will be a holiday weekend — have been fully cancelled, Farren said. No collections will be made on that day.

Highly unseasonable snow on Saturday, May 8, served to interfere with but did not cancel the drive. Particularly successful was the pickup by the Holy Name men in Blessed Sacrament parish, who, despite the weather, gathered approximately 21 tons. Murtigh P. Murphy was drive chairman. The men of St. Ambrose Holy Name Society, under the chairmanship of James W. Cleary, also turned in a large ton total. Good collections also were made by Our Lady of Lourdes, headed by James H. Farrell, and St. Philip Neri, chairmaned by William Trost.

EDMUND J. SCHNEPP, attorney and former Federal Bureau of Investigation agent, principal breakfast speaker, warned against the tactics of Communists in achieving leadership of large groups whose membership is composed of non-Communists. He cited as an example the Maritime Union of 80,000 members. With only 500 Communist members, he said, 107 of the 137 officers in the union are Communists.

Headed by city and county officials, more than 200 uniformed members of the Police Holy Name Society marched from the Communion Mass to the hotel for the breakfast. Marching with them were county deputy sheriffs and police officers of Irondequoit and Greece.

K.C. Member To Be Ordained In Ohio Ceremony

The Rev. Harold J. Goschke, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph F. Goschke, 12 St. Jacob Street, will be ordained to the Holy Priesthood, Saturday, May 22, in St. Anthony's Church, Steubenville, Ohio, by the Most Rev. John King Musso, J.C.D., D.D., Bishop of Steubenville.

For many years he has been a member of the Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus, and is one of few from the ranks of the Council to be raised to the Holy Priesthood.

He is a graduate of Holy Redeemer School and Aquinas Institute of this city. Two athletic scholarships were offered to him, one at Cornell University and the other at the University of Notre Dame, but they were declined in order to prepare for the Priesthood. He was graduated from St. Francis College, Loretto, Pa., where his Philosophical studies were completed; and his Theological studies were begun at St. Francis Seminary, Loretto, Pa.

Having volunteered for missionary work in the recently formed three year old Diocese of Steubenville, Ohio, he has completed his Theological course at Mount St. Mary Seminary of the West in Norwood, Cincinnati, Ohio.

Father Goschke will celebrate his First Solemn Mass in Holy Redeemer Church, corner of Hudson and Clifford Avenues, at 11 A. M. Sunday, May 30. Officers of the Mass will be Assistant Priest, the Rev. Raymond Wahl, Assistant Pastor of Holy Redeemer Church; Deacon, the Rev. Louis Mattiello, of St. Agnes Church, Lock Haven, Pa.; Subdeacon, the Rev. Mr. Vincent Tonzola, Brooklyn, New York; Master of Ceremonies, Rev. Mr. James Machak, Detroit, Mich.; Thurifer, the Rev. Mr. Joseph Malara, Steubenville, Ohio; Acolytes, Mr. Edward Hastings, Detroit, Michigan, and Mr. John Sauter, Franklin, Ohio; Cross bearer, Mr. James Geiger, Cleveland, Ohio.
