Final Tribute to Sister Felicitas

Funeral services for Sister M. Felicitas of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, who died Monday morning, May 17, 1948, were conducted Wednesday morning, May 19, at Nazareth Convent, Pittsford.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles F. Shay, assisted by the Rev. Paul G. Wohlrab, deacon, and the Rev. John S. Whalen, sub-deacon. The Rev. Joseph H. Gefell was master of ceremonies.

Present in the sanctuary were also the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas E. Connors, the Rev. Louis Edelman, and the Rev. Francis W. Luddy. The last blessing at the grave was given by Father Gefell, assisted by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns and the Rev. Michael J. Krieg.

Born in Canandaigua, Sister Felicitas entered the Sisters of Saint Joseph in 1876. She taught in several schools of the diocese and became principal of the Cathedral grammar school in 1890 which position she held until 1900. She was then named principal of the following schools in succession: Immaculate Conception, Ithaca; St. Francis de Sales, Geneva; and St. Patrick's Girls' Home. In 1924 she became principal of Holy Rosary School and remained there until 1936 when she retired to Nazareth Convent.

Taft Federal School Aid Bill Hit By Geneseo Men

Geneseo—Revision of the Taft-McCowan Bill, H. R. 2953, or prevention of its passage because it is "highly discriminatory against the more than 3,000,000 Catholic children in parochial schools," is asked in letters to four Congressmen by members of St. Mary's Holy Name Society.

Besides their own representative, Hon. James W. Wadsworth, the members sent their resolution to Representatives Leo E. Allen, Chairman, House Rules Committee; Fred A. Hartley, Jr., Chairman, Committee on Education and Labor; Joseph W. Martin, Chairman, House Republican Steering Committee.

This bill, the Holy Name Society's letter declares, "refuses to recognize the right of these children to receive equal assistance from the Federal Government with other children merely because they do not attend public schools."

"THE CHILDREN attending parochial schools," the protest continues, "do so not because they belong to the privileged class of the wealthy, but solely because they recognize that the public schools are unable to give them that knowledge of God, the soul, the future life, and the moral order which is absolutely necessary to equip them for the battle of life."

"If this nation is interested in recognizing these children as American citizens, as she unquestionably is, and if it is interested in seeing that these children receive equal education advantages with other children of the nation, as we logically suppose it is, then there can be no valid reason why the obvious purpose of the nation to assist underprivileged children to receive financial assistance from the nation should not be directed to embrace these children, too."

"Certainly they are underprivileged, for their parents cannot be expected to provide for them from their own meager and limited income schools and educational facilities to rival those of the Union."

Moreover, the ability of the parents of these children to provide proper education for their children will be appreciably lessened, since while they will have to bear the burden of an increased national income tax in addition to the already crushing local real estate taxes for edu-

Mr. Fischer is survived by his wife, Anna Noll Fischer; two daughters, Mrs. Herbert Ritterthaler and Mrs. Frances Woodard; three sons, George, Andrew, and Joseph; also thirteen grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

Members of Knights of St. John, in full dress uniform, acted as bearers. A large delegation of uniformed Knights of Commandery 40, and representatives of the Catholic Central Verein, St. Anthony's Benevolent Society, and Bakers' Union 14, acted as honorary bearers.
