POPE HAILS ITALY'S HEAD

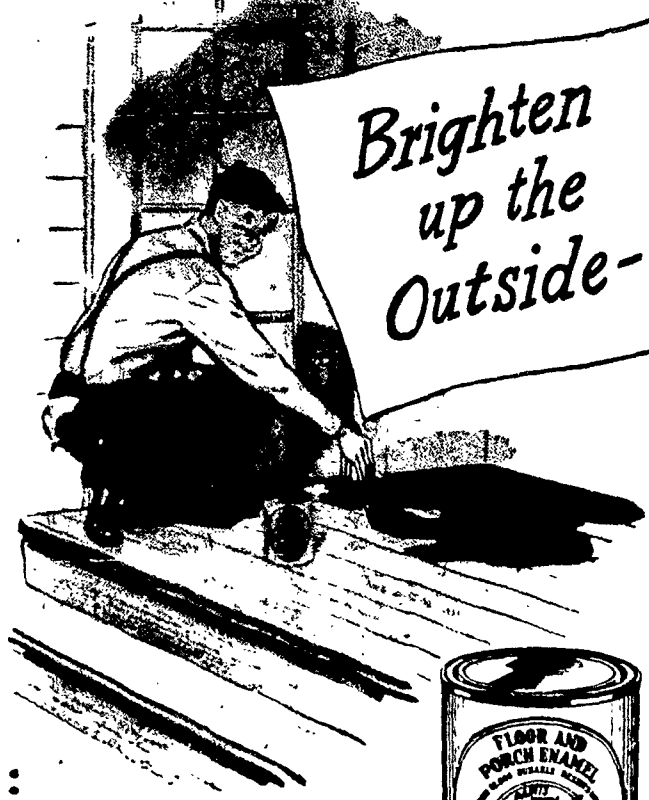
Vatican City—(NC)—A message of greetings sent to His Holiness Pope Pius XII by President of the Italian Republic Luigi Einaudi the second day after his election, together with the Pontiff's reply, have been printed in Osservatore Romano, Vatican City daily.

"While I have the honor to inform Your Holiness that the Italian Parliament at its May 11 session elected me President of the Republic," Mr. Einaudi's message stated. "I beg Your Holiness kindly to accept the expression of my devoted sentiments and the sincere wishes of the Italian nation together with my own personal wishes."

The Pope's reply read: "Grateful to God that beloved Italy is rising again to civil and Christian fortunes. We Thank Your Excellency for your cordial information and in giving Our blessing to your person and to the entire nation. We form Our wishes for prosperity in industrial peace for the nation and its first magistrate."

As the confusion of the political activity which characterized the election of the Italian President is dying down, the impression is growing here that the choice of Mr. Einaudi was a happy one.

Diocesan Holy Name Men Get Convention Challenge

(Continued from Page 1) "I beg Your Holiness kindly to accept the expression of my devoted sentiments and the sincere wishes of the Italian nation together with my own personal wishes."

As today's world faces the crossroads, the speaker asserted, "with men, women and children standing with outstretched arms pleading for a leadership which will bring them back to a sound and sane existence in peace with their fellowmen, there is no other band of Catholic men so organized as the Holy Name Society to assume this important task. It bars no one—king and pauper, industrialist and unionist, white and colored; it is the great melting pot of Catholic America."

THE CHURCH is being challenged today, Muth contended, "by forces of evil working with diabolical singleness of purpose to abolish the Christian ideals on which this nation was founded. We cannot be spiritual idealists," he stressed. "We must for get petty problems and parochial lines. Holy Name men throughout each diocese and throughout this nation must be willing to work together—to present a united front—to be eager to step forward in the Name of Jesus Christ, to meet the challenge."

Keynote of Holy Name activity in Milwaukee, Muth said, is service through the Holy Name Union central office, which deals with societies in 220 of the 231 parishes in the diocese. He said he was thrilled to know that the Rochester Diocesan Union is establishing a similar central office, and described some of the programs provided through the Milwaukee headquarters.

Muth was introduced by Cornelius J. Milliken, president of the Elmira Deanery Holy Name Union, convention hosts. Milliken quoted Pope Pius XII in a recent address to men of Catholic Action in Italy: "Now is the time for action. Are you ready?" Responsibility for the answer belongs, Milliken claimed, "not to the clergy, who will provide spiritual guidance, but to us, the laity, the soldiers of the Church militant, the men of the Holy Name." The Holy Name program, he added, must stress "modern, efficient, cooperative and coordinated efforts."

The Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, spiritual director of the Diocesan Union, expressing appreciation to Muth for his message, stated that "sometimes we get discouraged in our own little corner of the world, and succumb to the great temptation of today—to be appalled by the attack on Christianity; to feel that the world is going to pot and there is nothing we can do about it." This idea, he declared, "is not the spirit of faith, of Christ, of His Church. We are men of Christ, and together we can do something about it."

POINTING OUT that the day of the convention was Pentecost Sunday the Rev. William J. Naughton, pastor of St. Peter & Paul Church, Elmira, and spiritual director of the Elmira Deanery Union, reminded that "it is the birthday anniversary of the Catholic Church—a most appropriate day to call upon our Blessed Lady to inspire us." He said he felt sure the delegates, by their convention action, had begun "a bright new page in the history of the Holy Name Society."

BRIEF REMARKS were made by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William J. Brien, V.F., pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Elmira, and dean of Elmira Deanery, who welcomed the men to the city; the Rev. Arthur F. Florack, pastor of St. Michael's Church, Rochester, and assistant spiritual director of the Diocesan Holy Name Union, who described the success of his parish society has had since

parish, Rochester president of the Diocesan Union, presided. Reports were made by Frank E. Davis, general secretary; Nicholas Tosti, treasurer; Daniel E. Macken, committee on constitution; Paul M. Donovan of Elmira, committee on resolutions, and Executive Secretary Farren, who also distributed copies of the first issue of a Diocesan Holy Name Bulletin.
