St. John Knights Protest Magazine Used in Schools

An appeal to the Rochester Board of Education urging it to suspend the "Nation" from public school libraries or include in them literature which presents the other side of the story has been sounded by Rochester Regiment, Knights of St. John.

Writing to Charles F. Wray, president of the Board of Education, Colonel Joseph F. Wendelgass, representing the Knights of St. John deplored recent evidence of religious bigotry in the "Nation."

The letter, said Colonel Wendelgass, was written particularly in behalf of the parents within the organization whose children attend the public schools.

The letter concludes: "Rochester can be proud of the many spires which rise heavenward in its city. Proud too, of the tolerance of her people and the cooperation of the religious groups among themselves and in every community effort. We are sure that your Board does not wish to merit the condemnation of our people for terminating that happy condition. We would rather believe that you would cherish the applause of your fellow citizens for solidifying and promoting the fellowship and tolerance now happily existing in our community."

"On behalf of the organization, which we have the honor of representing, may we urge you either to suspend the "Nation" from our public school libraries as long as it continues its attacks upon any church or that your Board allow to be placed in the library such periodicals and literature as will give the 'other fellow's' view."

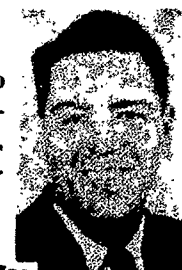
John Fisher Club Hears Fr. Crimmens

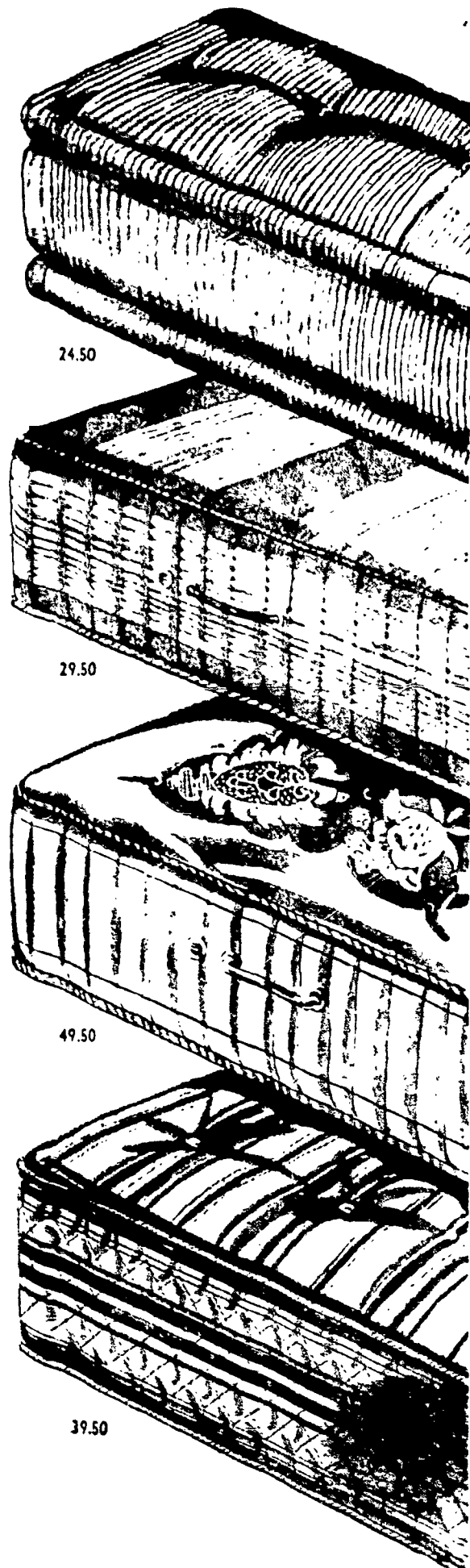
